



Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

As a modern society, we often place ourselves above the civilizations that preceded us. When it comes to justice and sophistication of the law, we like to think about ourselves as being on a much higher level than the ancient "eye for an eye, tooth for a tooth" rule. In reality, however, we seem to be at a level that in various ways falls short even of the laws of the Code of Hammurabi. If someone knocks out our eye, we are ready to rip their head off. One doesn't need to look far: in school; it only takes to be a ginger, overweight or have protruding ears to expose yourself to ridicule and rejection. Or in the work environment one might be a subject of mobbing, usually motivated by jealousy or craving for power. In the modern industrial jungle, the rule seems to be: "pluck out two eyes before they can strike you back."

On the other hand, a significant number of people function in the opposite extreme, where their attitudes are the antithesis of revenge. When they get hurt, not only they do not defend themselves nor take revenge, but they blame themselves for the blows inflicted by others. Various types of abuse can imprint a mark of non-existent guilt on people's self-esteem. People from this group are not even at the level of the "eye for an eye" principle, as they assume towards themselves the attitude of their abusers, after someone knocks out their eye, they knock out the remaining one, making themselves blind to fundamental justice.

But we cannot forget that the reality might be still different. We may not find ourselves on the side of those who experience harm, but become those who cause it. The one who inflicts the harm is really the victim of their own act. Disgust with themselves, contempt, hatred, rage, humiliation, shame, defilement, tormenting remorse are the common experience of an abuser. It is not a disgrace to be hurt, but to hurt others.

The Old Testament law of "an eye for an eye" was not intended as a principle of revenge, but of a just defense, and it was established to limit the vendetta, preventing an escalation of violence. Revenge or retaliation seeks not only to get back at the opponent, but to cause more suffering, while the principle of "an eye for an eye" was intended to deter others from similar behavior; therefore, however imperfect, it was in some sense a social warning.

Jesus sets a high standard few can achieve today: when someone strikes you on your right cheek, turn the other one as well. To hit someone on the right cheek, you have to either use your left hand or the back of your right hand, which given the majority of people are right-handed, is usually the weaker blow. Turning the left cheek, therefore, we allow for a potentially stronger hit. Without the experience of Christ's love no one would be able to expose themselves like that. The uniqueness of the Christian principles is that they have love at their foundation. The love that is not a result of an emotional response, but rather a gift from above.

LENTEN DISCIPLINES OF FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Catholics in good health ages 18-59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal. Catholics ages 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays of Lent.
