Nevertheless, in his letters, Saint Paul is adamant that we should not be ashamed of being followers of Christ. Good stewards are not ashamed of their allegiance to Christ. They do not hide their faith. Reflect on this question: Are you willing to speak about following Christ Jesus no matter who your listeners happen to be?

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Convinced of our own freedom, having our own opinions and views, we are reluctant to accept opinions of others, especially those with authority over us. We are even more reluctant to meet the expectations of others. We see them almost as if they were an attack on our personal freedom. We can observe it in children when they are being presented with a rule or expectation. In fact, many parents, anticipating an unpleasant reaction from their children, give up on their hopes and the rules they have set. Yet today's Liturgy of the Word is full of commands: *Go forth from the land of your kinsfolk* – the order given by God to Abram; *Listen to him* – God's encouragement to the witnesses of the transfiguration of Jesus on Mount Tabor; *Bear your share of hardship for the gospel* – Paul's reminder to Timothy.

It is hard to imagine a biblical text without principles. They reach their peak in the Decalogue. God's chosen people knew the importance of His rules and commandments, and reflected it in the words of Psalm 19: *The precepts of the LORD are right, rejoicing the heart. The command of the LORD is clear, enlightening the eye.* These instructions play an important role in the history of salvation. First of all, they show God as a commanding Father, who requires man to fulfill His will. This image is not in opposition to the idea of God as love. The Father never stopped loving his Only Begotten Son, yet he accepted His death on the cross as an act of His Son's obedience to the Father's will. God commands man out of concern for him, especially for his salvation. And this care comes from God's love.

God is the supreme example for all who have been entrusted the role of formulating and promulgating laws of all kinds. This is especially true for all fathers and mothers. In their parental love, there must be room for firm but prudent commands and prohibitions and for their enforcement.

The role of lawgivers is entrusted to superiors, managers, employers, and parents. To be constructive, their orders must be dictated by the general good, as well as the good of the person to whom they may concern. Therefore, they cannot be deprived of love and service to man. Moreover, they must inspire confidence both in the person in charge and in the content of their commands. Only the rules built in this way have a chance of being successfully implemented. Children, employees, and subordinates have the right to know the motivation behind those rules, but in the end, they should show a certain submission, obedience, humility and trust. This is the attitude we assume towards the commands of God, and in order that our human rules are similarly accepted and fulfilled, they need to be formulated in a similar way.

God, who commands, loves and saves man, makes us realize that not only the renewal of religious life, but also family and social life will not happen without serious respect for sound commands.
