Christian stewards pray for an open heart so that they may hear the voice of the Lord, heed the continuous call to come away from their former way of living and reprioritize their lives in the light of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Do we believe Christ has the power to transform our lives? Do we take time to listen for his call?

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Every time when the Gospel passage invites us to Bethany, to the home of Lazarus, Martha and Mary, we rediscover the very interesting dynamics between the three siblings and Jesus. Martha is always the first to meet Jesus; every time when Jesus visits them she has a long conversation with Him. This time – given the circumstances of her brother's death – it's a conversation about the resurrection and about faith. Her dialogs with Jesus are always theological in nature, and like a good theologian, at some point, she realizes that wisdom and knowledge, the two intellectual aspects of our cognition, are not enough to understand why Jesus delayed his arrival and allowed for his friend Lazarus to die. Therefore, she runs to Mary, her sister, knowing that her relationship with Jesus is different.

Interestingly, Mary begins her conversation with Jesus with the exact same words Martha used a few moments ago. But there is a subtle difference between the two sisters: Mary falls at Jesus' feet in a gesture of prayer. It is a reminder of that moment in their home when the Lord praised her for listening, choosing the better part, when she knelt at his feet. Only at this moment Jesus is moved and weeps, not during the theological discourse with Martha, but in response to Mary's prayer. God is moved when He hears a prayer. He is indifferent if we approach him through theology but without prayer. It is truly a relationship: if we are obedient to him, by putting him first in our lives, by worshipping him, even before we approach him with our intellect, He is obedient to the obedient. Our prayer is accepted by God as if it was the Word of God, only if his Word is truly accepted by us. It is not enough to know that there is a God, to know about him, without ever encountering him. One must be with him, cling to him, fall at his feet.

And there's finally the third sibling, Lazarus. He never says anything; we do not know anything about his relationship with Jesus, except that everyone knows that Jesus loves him. Why was Jesus so deeply moved at the tomb of Lazarus? After all, Lazarus was neither an apostle nor a disciple, he did not perform miracles, he did not cast out evil spirits, he did not prophesy. Jesus loved him very much, and there is no indication that Lazarus deserved the kind of love that raised him from the grave. Lazarus is an ultimate reminder that neither theology nor prayer can merit us the love of God. God loves us without merit, not "because of something," but often "in spite of something." In Lazarus God loves someone who hasn't done anything noteworthy in his life, just... died...

This reminds me of a traditional Jewish story told about the Last Day. God sent his angels to resurrect all the dead. For seven days they called the dead to rise from their graves. Many presented themselves before the throne of God, but some continued to sleep as if God's call had not reached them. God asked one of his angels: "Why have many not awakened from death?" "Because in life they did not listen to the Word of God, and this insensitivity remained with them after death!"


