Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Reading the narrative of the trial over the Son of God, we see amazing replacements. Instead of Barabbas, Jesus is crucified. The judge of the world, God, innocent, who stands before people who are guilty of many sins and allows himself to be judged. Rather than Jesus declaring his own kingship, Pilate does it. Jesus is weighed down with a wooden instrument of torture, but instead of him, Simon of Cyrene is forced to carry the burden. All these substitutions bring to mind the swap of the guilty with the innocent: one here is acquitted although he is guilty, another one gets blamed even though He doesn't deserve it.

As humans, we tend to avoid what is unpleasant, difficult, and even sometimes fall into the false belief that everyone can be subject to suffering, but not us. Meanwhile, even the Son of God was not spared the false accusation, the vicious trial, the torture, rejection, denunciation, beating, disgrace, insults and death. The Passion of Christ gathers all the realities from which we try to run away, escaping into the world of imaginary beliefs about life.

What draws our attention in today's liturgy is the considerable length of the description of the Passion, in comparison to other events related to the life of Jesus. The early Church saw in the Passion of Christ an exceptionally valuable treasure of truth, not only about our salvation, but also about human fate. Meanwhile, we tend to avoid even thinking about uncomfortable, inconvenient truths, including the truth about our death. We cover the traces of failure resorting to lies; we push into oblivion the possibility of experiencing suffering as a consequence of our own bad choices. Jesus in his Passion brings up what we do not want to remember. He reminds us that we cannot always escape defeat, we cannot avoid suffering forever, we cannot run away from the claws of death.

But there is one thing we absolutely can and need to avoid, something way worse than all aforementioned sufferings: we can escape eternal damnation because He has made a saving substitution. Without referring to the Passion of Christ, our struggle with fate is doomed to a collision with the truth that will inevitably crush us. Matthew writes that at the moment of Jesus' agony, the dead rose from their graves. Only in Christ can we overcome the hitherto unconquerable reality: eternal death.

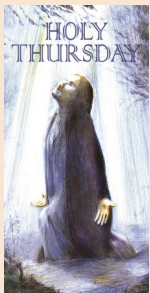
