Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

The role of the shepherd is to lead the flock and to take responsibility for it, and it is achieved simply by a sheep's familiarity with his voice. The fourth Sunday of Easter was established as the Day of Prayer for Vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, religious and consecrated life, that is, for vocations to life with Christ, in Christ and through Christ.

It is not difficult to notice that in our world it becomes increasingly challenging for people to understand their vocation and respond to it. This applies not only to the difficulties related to making commitment for an entire life to a specific vocation – to marriage, priesthood or consecrated life, but above all difficulties related to the implementation of the basic vocation of human kind, which is the call to holiness.

Good Shepherd Sunday is an opportunity to pray for all vocations. The concept of vocation is most often understood as God's calling to a certain way of life. Each vocation is a great gift from God, a gift that mysteriously resounds in the heart, regardless of age and gender. Of course, God calls whomever He wants and whenever He wants. We need a deeper reflection to understand God's call extended to each one of us. We need to enter deeper into our inner room in order to hear the call and accept it with our whole heart and mind. This has tangible consequences for our Christian life, expressed in constant strengthening of our relationship with Christ the Good Shepherd, in all circumstances of our lives, regardless of whether we are on restful waters or walk through the dark valley. After all, the Lord is always our Shepherd.

In today's Gospel Jesus speaks of himself as the Good Shepherd who calls his sheep by name. Today's crisis in understanding of our basic vocation to holiness can be seen as a crisis of identity caused by modern relativism and rejection of truth in favor of personal preference or opinion. In this context, Jesus' call to his sheep can be seen as a call to return to our true identity as children of God and to reject the false personas that we have created for ourselves. Jesus calls us to return to the truth and to reject the lies that we have been told by the world. It is a call to reject the false idols that we have created for ourselves and to return to the one true God. We are reminded that we are all called to be holy just as He is holy. Holiness is our identity, our vocation, our call. It is a call to reject relativism and embrace absolute truth which can only be found in God.

Jesus calling his sheep by name reveals to us who we are, reveals to us the truth. Only responding to this call will satisfy us, only by following our Shepherd's voice we have the promise that *we shall not want* and that our *cup will overflow*.
