

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

We read in the Acts of the Apostles: *When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight.* On the other hand, in the Gospel of St. Matthew, we hear the assurance of Jesus: *And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age.* So how is it finally? Did He ascend into heaven, or is He still with us? After all, we know physically that it is impossible to be in two places at once.

We are attached and limited to our spatial imagination. Yet, we are called to activate the imagination of the heart. Yes, a thing, an object, cannot be in two places at the same time, however, a person can. How? It is important to note the difference between personal and material presence. Let's say we put a washing machine or a fridge in one place, the object takes up some space and it just is there. And the person? Someone may be physically sitting in a church pew, but internally be somewhere else entirely. How many times do we have the feeling that someone is physically next to us, but spiritually or mentally far away. Conversely, it is possible to be physically distant from someone but remain close internally.

Sometimes we say to someone: "You are in my heart." It doesn't need to be an empty, sentimental phrase. The personal presence takes place where there is an authentic encounter, where there is a bond between people. I am in the hearts of those who love me. I carry in my heart those I love. The personal presence is stronger, greater than space and time.

Personal presence also has the advantage of not being simply binary: being there or not, but can be given an in-between value, being more present or being less present. One can talk about a certain intensity of the personal presence, about its quality, while a fridge or washing machine cannot be present more than just to exist.

Jesus as a man could physically be only in a certain place of space and time. The Ascension marks the final completion of his earthly mission. We no longer have a chance to see Him and listen to Him the way the Apostles did. The promise *I am with you always* is about personal presence, not about the physical one. It is a spiritual, inner presence. The promise of such presence accompanies the missionary mandate: *Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them,* as Jesus commands the disciples to help maintain his presence in the Church. This is done through the Word, through the Sacraments, through community.

Christ ascended into heaven not only as God, but also as man. In this sense, the Ascension shows that the proper "place" of man is in God himself. The fate of Jesus is a foreshadowing of our fate. The Ascension shows the true direction of human development: the intensification of God's presence in us, up to its highest "density," i.e. heaven. Because heaven is not something, but someone. Heaven, that is God, matures within us. Ascension is not about space, but about the true dimension of humanity: our relationship with God.
