Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

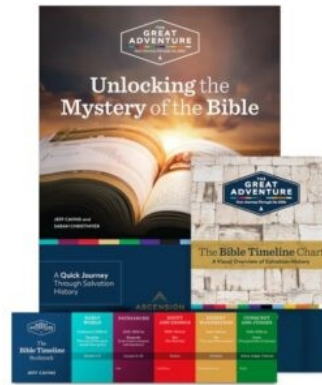
In the Gospel of Luke, we encounter the moment when Jesus, standing in the synagogue, declares, *"Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing"*. This statement carries a depth of meaning that goes beyond our initial understanding of the word 'fulfilled'. Often, we equate fulfillment with completion – a sense that something has been brought to its final state. However, Jesus' proclamation invites us to see fulfillment not as the end, but as the beginning of God's ongoing work in our lives and in the world.

When Jesus says the Scripture is fulfilled *today*, He is revealing that God's promises are active and present. This *fulfillment* is an indication that God hears us, knows our needs, and is continuously working to bring His promises to fruition. It is a reminder that God's work is not static or completed, but dynamic and ongoing. Just as the listeners in the synagogue might have expected an immediate and complete realization of God's promises, we too can fall into the trap of expecting instant answers and solutions.

Instead, Jesus' words remind us that God's fulfillment is a process. It is a journey that unfolds in God's perfect timing. We are called to trust in this process, to have faith that God is with us, listening to our prayers, and responding in ways that are best for us, even when we do not see the immediate results.

This understanding of fulfillment is why we continue our religious practices, as Jesus instructs us in Luke 22:19, to *do this in remembrance of me*. Our practices are not mere rituals; they are acts of faith and remembrance that keep us connected to the ongoing work of God in our lives. They remind us that while God's promises are being fulfilled, our participation through prayer, worship, and acts of love is essential. These practices keep our hearts open to God's grace and attuned to His presence.

Therefore, as we reflect on Jesus' proclamation of fulfillment, let us embrace the active and ongoing nature of God's promises. Let us trust that He hears us and is faithfully working to bring about His will. In our waiting and in our actions, may we find peace in knowing that God's fulfillment is ever-present, guiding us closer to the ultimate realization of His kingdom.

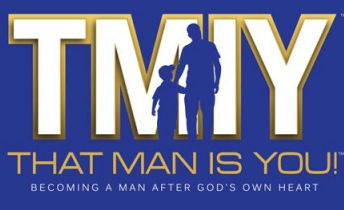

The Baptism of Christ in the Jordan

“After Jesus was baptized, he came up from the water and behold, the heavens were opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming upon him. And a voice came from the heavens, saying, ‘This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.’”

—Matthew 3:16-17

Reflection by Bishop Robert Barron

How strange and scandalous seems the baptism of Jesus. Christ the Lord, the Messiah, the Son of God, the sinless Lamb who takes away the sins of the world, receives for himself the baptism of John, a baptism of repentance. Why is Jesus seeking a baptism of repentance? The difficulty is reflected in the Baptist’s confusion: “I should be baptized by you; and yet you come to me.” It cannot be true that the Lord Jesus is a sinner, because if this is true, all of Christian revelation is undermined.

As is usually the case with the Bible, what we have here is a startling surprise. Before ever a word passes Jesus’ lips, he is presenting his mission. In this gesture, God lays aside his glory and humbly joins us in the muddy waters of our sinfulness. Though sinless, Christ stands with us. Though we are sinners, Christ does not remain aloof. Jesus says, “Give in for now. We must do this to fulfill all righteousness.” Fulfilling righteousness, in the old dispensation, would have meant something like “doing what God wants” or “getting right with God.” Yet God in Christ takes this a step further. Now we see that “all righteousness” has to do with God’s setting things right with us and for us by humbly standing with the sinners he means to save.

As we pray this first decade of the Luminous Mysteries, let us contemplate our own Baptism, which unites us to the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world.




