

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection


In our Gospel reading from Luke, we witness the awe-inspiring event of the Transfiguration. Jesus takes Peter, James, and John up a mountain and reveals His divine glory. This moment is a powerful reminder of our true citizenship in the Kingdom of God. The disciples glimpse the radiant glory of Christ, a vision that transcends the confines of this earthly life. It is a reminder that our ultimate home is not in this world, but with God. As citizens of heaven, we are called to live with an awareness of this divine reality, letting it shape our lives and guide our actions.

In our journey through life, we often grapple with feelings of not belonging. We may find ourselves in situations where we feel out of place, disconnected, or even rejected. These moments of alienation can be deeply unsettling. Yet, it is precisely in these times that God invites us to remember where our true belonging lies. The Transfiguration encourages us to lift our gaze beyond the immediate challenges and to remember our heavenly calling. We are not alone; we belong to God, and He has prepared a place for us in His eternal kingdom.

Turning to Genesis, we see God's covenant with Abram. God promises Abram descendants as numerous as the stars and a land for them to inhabit. This covenant underscores God's desire for a people who belong to Him, who trust in His promises and live under His guidance. We are part of this covenant family, inheritors of God's promises. Our belonging is first and foremost to God, who calls us His own. This sense of belonging gives us a firm foundation and a clear identity as children of God.

In his letter to the Philippians, Paul exhorts believers to remember that their true citizenship is in heaven. He contrasts this with those who focus solely on earthly matters. For us, this message is crucial. Our earthly journey is temporary, and our ultimate allegiance is to God's kingdom. As citizens of heaven, we are called to live in a way that reflects this eternal perspective, prioritizing our relationship with God and our commitment to His values.

In the midst of our longing for belonging, it is important to recognize that our ultimate home is not in any earthly place or community. Our true belonging is found in our relationship with God and our citizenship in His heavenly kingdom. This understanding should shape our lives, guiding us to live with an eternal perspective and to seek God's presence in all that we do.

The Agony in the Garden

"When he arrived at the place he said to them, 'Pray that you may not undergo the test.' After withdrawing about a stone's throw from them and kneeling, he prayed, saying, 'Father, if you are willing, take this cup away from me; still, not my will but yours be done.' And to strengthen him an angel from heaven appeared to him. He was in such agony and he prayed so fervently that his sweat became like drops of blood falling on the ground. When he rose from prayer and returned to his disciples, he found them sleeping from grief. He said to them, 'Why are you sleeping? Get up and pray that you may not undergo the test."

—Luke 22:40-45

Reflection by Bishop Robert Barron

In the Garden of Gethsemane, the Son of God enters into the psychological and spiritual grace of the sinner. Paul the Apostle says that Christ became sin. That's his mission: to bring the light and forgiveness of God into the depths of god forsakenness. He's accompanied only by Peter, James, and John, but even those three closest disciples he ultimately leaves behand. He's "pressed down to the ground"—the great spiritual writers of our tradition interpret this as the sins of the world pressing down upon him—and he sweats blood. Jesus, the very Son of God, enters into the state of alienation from God. He feels the suffering of the lost.

In that state, he offers an anguished prayer: "Father, if you are willing, remove this cup from me." The whole of Jesus' life is a battle against the devil culminating in the cross—and in the garden, the temptation to avoid following God's will is evident.

Yet struggling against every instinct in his body, he demonstrates fortitude, utterly aligning his will to that of the Father.: "Yet, not my will but yours be done." Here at the very center of the drama, and from the center of the co-inherence of the divine and human wills, comes this prayer that signals trust in the divine providence.

As we pray this decade, let us see the aching loneliness of Christ in the garden as his entry into the psychological and spiritual space of the sinner, and to see his great prayer in the garden as a guide for our own prayers and the key to lasting joy and peace: "Not my will but yours be done."



What is an icon?

An icon is a religious image to be used for veneration and prayer. Icons have been a part of the Church's history since the 4th Century. Often painted on wood, icons depict Jesus, Mary, or the saints, and they are highly symbolic. Venerating an icon or praying before it can help us grow in our faith by

giving us a visual representation of truths of the faith.


Mary at the Foot of the Cross

This icon was just unveiled by the Archdiocese of Denver to mark the beginning of a 9 year novena which will conclude in 2033, the 2000th Anniversary of the crucifixion, death, and resurrection of Jesus. This icon was painted by Elizabeth Zelasko, and there are several important symbols depicted.



Mary's arms are positioned as if she is cradling Jesus as a baby. She still has her baby's swaddling cloth, but her arms are now empty.

God sends two angels to minister to Mary during her time of suffering and grief.



Greek Abbreviation for "Meter Theou," the Mother of God.

The bones of Adam are arranged in the shape XC, which is Christ in Greek. The bones, a rib and an arm bone, symbolize Adam and Eve's sin and points to Jesus as the New Adam and Mary as the New Eve.

The walls of Jerusalem indicate that Jesus was crucified outside the city.



The solar eclipse recalls the darkness that came at the moment of Jesus' death.
