

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Today's Liturgy of the Word turns our attention to two passages that reveal a crucial aspect of our relationship with God: the importance of repentance. The readings from Luke and 1 Corinthians remind us that while sin is a serious matter, it is not sin itself that creates an insurmountable obstacle between us and God. Rather, it is our lack of repentance that hinders our relationship with Him.

In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus tells the parable of the barren fig tree. The owner of the vineyard is frustrated with the tree's lack of fruit and instructs the gardener to cut it down. However, the gardener intercedes, asking for one more year to cultivate the tree and help it bear fruit. This parable beautifully illustrates God's patience and mercy. He is willing to give us time to repent, to turn away from our sins, and to bear the fruits of righteousness.

The fig tree represents each one of us. There are moments in our lives when we fail to bear fruit, when we fall into sin and turn away from God's love. But Jesus, our divine gardener, pleads on our behalf, offering us the opportunity to repent and renew our relationship with God. The key to this renewal lies in our willingness to acknowledge our sins and seek forgiveness. God's patience is tremendous, but it is our repentance that unlocks the door to His mercy.

In Paul's letter to the Corinthians, we are given a stark reminder of the consequences of unrepentance. Paul recounts the history of the Israelites, who despite witnessing God's mighty works, fell into sin and disobedience. He warns the Corinthians not to be complacent, reminding them that the same fate could befall them if they do not turn away from their sins. Paul's words are a call to vigilance and humility, urging us to recognize our need for God's mercy and to repent sincerely.

The message of both readings is clear: every sin can be forgiven, but it requires our willingness to repent. God's mercy is not automatic; it is activated by our contrite hearts and our genuine desire to seek His forgiveness. We must be like the fig tree, allowing the divine gardener to work in our hearts, cultivating us to bear the fruits of atonement and virtue.

God's patience with us is boundless, but it requires our response. Let us not delay in turning to Him with repentant hearts, trusting in His infinite mercy. In doing so, we will experience the fullness of His love and the joy of being in right relationship with Him.

May we always remember that it is our lack of repentance, not our sins, that creates obstacles in our relationship with God. Let us strive to cultivate hearts that are quick to repent and eager to receive God's forgiveness, so that we may bear the fruits of righteousness and grow ever closer to Him.

The Scourging at the Pillar

"Then Pilate took Jesus and had him scourged. And the soldiers wove a crown out of thorns and placed it on his head, and clothed him in a purple cloak, and they came to him and said, 'Hail, King of the Jews!' And they struck him repeatedly."

—John 19:1-2

Reflection by Bishop Robert Barron

After Pilate sentences Jesus to death, he has Jesus scourged at the pillar, which was a customary torture leading up to crucifixion. We know from archeological evidence and from written accounts what this form of punishment was like. Using a variety of weapons and instruments, Roman scourgers would brutalize their victims.

Hans Urs von Balthasar writes that even those passive aspects of Jesus' passion in which he allows himself to be used—including the scourging at the pillar—are expressions of "his active will to give himself up in self-surrender," a loving completion of God's promise to his people.

Presenting the scourged Jesus to the crowds, Pilate says, "Behold the man." In the delicious irony of John's Gospel, Pilate is unwittingly drawing attention to the fact that Jesus, completely acquiescent to the will of the Father, even to the point of accepting torture and death, is in fact "the man," humanity at its fullest and most free.

Throughout this decade of the Rosary, let us contemplate the brutality endured by Christ during his scourging and see his loving acceptance of suffering as the means through which he conquers sin and redeems humanity.

The Annunciation of the Lord

March 25th

- The Feast of the Annunciation celebrates the actual incarnation of Jesus, when he became flesh in his mother's womb.
- Even though it is not a holy day of obligation, it is still very important.
- The Feast of the Annunciation is celebrated 9 months before Christmas.
- The Annunciation is a good time to remember the humanity of pre-born children in their mothers' wombs.

"In families with young children, this feast would be a good time to begin teaching youngsters important lessons about the inestimable value God places on human life.

First, that He loved us so much that He chose to become one of us—to take on our humanity so completely that he "became flesh", as utterly weak and dependent as any human infant is. Second, God became "like us in all things except sin" at the moment of His conception in Mary's womb, not at some later time. The Feast of the Annunciation is a celebration of the actual Incarnation of Jesus Christ."
