

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Today, the Word of God calls us to reflect on obedience to the will of God - a call that is often challenging but always life-giving. Through the readings from Acts and the Gospel of John, we witness how obedience transforms lives and are invited to consider its impact on our own journey.

In Acts, the apostles boldly stand before the Sanhedrin and proclaim, "We must obey God rather than men." Despite persecution and threats, they remain committed to their mission, rejoicing because they are counted worthy to suffer for the name of Jesus. Their obedience is rooted in faith – a trust in God's plan, even when it involves difficulty.

In John's Gospel, we see Peter invited to obedience once more. After the miraculous catch of fish, Jesus asks him three times, "Do you love me?" With each affirmation, Peter is entrusted to "feed my sheep." Despite Peter's past failures, Jesus prepares him for his mission, saying, "Follow me." Peter's obedience, like that of the apostles, demands faith and trust in God's plan, even when the path forward is unclear.

This theme of obedience resonates with me as I shared with you last weekend that I've been reassigned as pastor of St. Peter Parish for the next six years. It is a call I accept with gratitude and humility, knowing it is part of God's will for me and for this community. Like Peter, I am entrusted with the mission to "feed His sheep," to guide and serve this parish with love, trusting in God's grace as we move forward together. I ask for your prayers for all of us to seek God's will with courage and faith.

This weekend also marks the Archbishop's Catholic Appeal commitment day – a moment for each of us to respond to God's call. Participating in the appeal may feel like a sacrifice, and we might wonder if our contributions make a difference or if the timing is right. Yet, like the apostles, we are called to trust in God's plan. Supporting the appeal is an act of faith and obedience, a way to say, "Yes, Lord, I trust in Your will, and I want to help further Your mission."

Obedience to God's will often means stepping into the unknown, making sacrifices, or overcoming fears. But as Peter and the apostles show us, obedience leads to transformation – it deepens our relationship with God and allows His grace to flow through us into the world.

As we reflect on these readings, I invite each of you to ask: How is God calling you to follow Him today? Perhaps it's through prayer, forgiveness, acts of service, or generosity to the Archbishop's Catholic Appeal. Whatever the call, do not be afraid to say "yes." Trust that God's will, though challenging, leads to joy and peace.



The Ascension of the Lord

"When they had gathered together they asked him, 'Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He answered them, 'It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.' When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, 'Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven.""

—Acts 1:6-11

Reflection by Bishop Robert Barron

After commissioning his disciples—and us—to proclaim the Gospel to the whole world, Jesus ascends to heaven, where he takes his place at God's right hand.

How can we even begin to make sense of this mystery, and what does it have to do with us? When we consider the Ascension, it's important to understand that Jesus has not gone up, up, and away, but rather, if I can put it this way, more deeply into our world. He has gone to a dimension that transcends and yet impinges upon our universe. And the prayer of Jesus is that the earth will be filled with the glory of God, that it will be transformed and elevated according to God's purposes. As Jesus leaves the scene-at least in the most obvious sense—he opens the stage for us, so that we might act in his name and in accord with his Spirit. It is precisely those who are most focused on the things of heaven that do most good here below. Those who pray most intently are most effective in the practical realm. This is opened up by the Ascension.

For this decade, meditate on the great mystery of Jesus' bodily Ascension, which is an invitation for us to go on mission.

Saint Damien of Molokai

Feast: May 10th Patron of People with Leprosy



Quick Facts

- Born Jozef de Vuester in Belgium in 1840
- Grew up on a farm
- Entered the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary and took the name Damien
- In 1864 his brother was assigned to Hawaii, but could not go because of illness. Damien volunteered to take his place, and was ordained a priest.
- Worked as a priest on the island of Hawaii for 9 years
- In 1873 decided to serve the leper colony on the Kalaupapa Peninsula; he cared for the people there and served there for 16 years
- Eventually contracted leprosy and died in 1889, was buried in Molokai.
