

## Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Today's readings invite us to reflect on a profound spiritual truth: sometimes, we must let go – not only of harmful attachments but even of good things – to embrace something greater. This is a lesson that the apostles, the early Christians, and even we today must learn in our journey of faith.


In the Gospel of John, Jesus prepares His disciples for His departure. They had walked with Him, listened to His voice, and witnessed His miracles. His physical presence was a source of comfort and strength. Yet, He tells them that He must leave, but He will send the Holy Spirit to guide them. The apostles had to let go of their attachment to Jesus' physical presence to receive the deeper gift of the Spirit dwelling within them. This was not a loss, but a transformation — a movement from seeing Christ externally to experiencing Him internally.

In the first reading from Acts, we see another necessary detachment. The early Church faced a crisis: should Gentile converts be required to follow Jewish customs, such as circumcision? For Jewish Christians, these traditions were sacred, deeply woven into their identity. Yet, through the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the apostles discerned that these customs were no longer necessary for salvation. They had to let go of their attachment to the old ways to embrace the new covenant in Christ – a faith that transcended cultural boundaries.

Finally, in Revelation, we are given a vision of the heavenly Jerusalem. In this city, there is no need for the sun or the moon, for God Himself is its light. There is no temple, for the Lord dwells fully among His people. Even the physical structures that once symbolized God's presence are no longer needed, because His presence is now complete and eternal. This passage reminds us that even good things – things that once served a purpose – must sometimes be left behind when God calls us to something greater.

What does this mean for us today? We all have attachments – some harmful, some good. We may cling to traditions, relationships, or ways of thinking that once served us well but now hold us back from deeper faith. Perhaps we struggle to let go of past successes, familiar comforts, or even our own plans for the future. But God calls us to trust Him, to release what is temporary so we can receive what is eternal.

Letting go is not about loss; it is about transformation. Just as the apostles received the Spirit, just as the early Church embraced a new way of faith, just as the heavenly Jerusalem shines with God's glory, we too are invited to step forward in faith. May we have the courage to release what is passing so that we may embrace the fullness of God's presence in our lives.


## Spiritual Adoption



## The Coronation of the Blessed Virgin Mary

"A great sign appeared in the sky, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars." —Revelation 12:1

## **Reflection by Bishop Robert Barron**

The Catechism also teaches us that Mary, having been assumed body and soul into heaven, is 'exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death.'

The Queenship of Mary, however, is far from a sentimental image. One of the great biblical points of reference for the coronation of Mary is the 12th chapter of the book of Revelation. John the visionary sees 'a great portent in heaven: a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars.' Clothed with the sun and with the moon under her feet, she is a figure of cosmic significance and power; and crowned, coronated, we know that she is a Queen.

Then we discover that she is a Queen mother, for she was 'crying out in birth pangs, in the agony of giving birth.' Next, we learn that this cosmic Queen mother is also a warrior: 'Another portent appeared in heaven; a great red dragon, with seven heads and ten horns...The dragon stood before the woman, who was about to bear a child so that he might devour her child as soon as it was born.' What does the red dragon symbolize? Rooted in references from Psalm 89, from the prophet Isaiah, and from the book of Genesis, the red dragon is a sort of summation of all the forces that stand opposed to God and God's creative intention for the human race. He stands athwart the woman and her son.

After the woman's child is born, the son is snatched away, and then a great war breaks out in heaven: Michael and his angels against the dragon and his angels, and the enemy is thrown down. What is being portrayed here, in beautifully vivid language, is the fact that the Queen of Heaven and her Son are the victors in a great cosmic struggle. They embody the victory of God over the forces of chaos, violence, hatred, cruelty, oppression, and injustice.

As we pray this last decade, contemplate the coronation of Mary in heaven—not as a sentimental ceremony, but as a dramatic and subversive mystery, the total victory of God in Christ.

## **Eucharistic Miracle Spotlight**

La Rochelle, France 1461

On Easter Sunday, a woman brought her 12 year old son Bertrand to Mass. Bertrand had had a serious fall at age 7 and was paralyzed and mute.

At Mass he made known to his mother that he wanted to receive Communion, and she told the priest. Initially the priest didn't want to let him receive the Eucharist because he could not go to Confession due to his muteness. Eventually the priest agreed to give Communion to the boy.

After receiving the Eucharist, miraculously healed of his paralysis and muteness. The first words he spoke were "Our help is in the name of the Lord."

## **Pope Saint Paul VI**

Feast: May 29

#### **Ouick Facts**

- Born Giovanni Battista Montini in 1897
- Was pope from 1963-1978
- Was pope for most of the 2nd Vatican Council
- Ordained a priest on May 29, 1920
- Was particularly concerned with social justice
- His most famous encyclical, *Humanae Vitae*, condemned the use of artificial birth control and contraceptives. He accurately predicted the consequences of widespread contraception, such as infidelity, premarital sex, and increased abortions.
- Traveled around the world during his pontificate; in 1970 there was an assassination attempt on him which he survived.
- Died in 1978
- Canonized in 2018 by Pope Francis
