

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Today, we reflect on a profound truth: our actions often reveal how little we truly know God. We see this in our daily lives, but perhaps most strikingly, we see it in how we behave inside the very house of God - our churches.


In the Gospel of John, Jesus prays for unity, that we may be one with Him and the Father. He desires that we recognize His presence, that we may know Him intimately. Yet, how often do we enter the church building as if it were just another place? We chat idly, we scroll through our phones, we treat the sacred space with casual disregard. This is not because we are intentionally disrespectful, but because we have not truly grasped "who God is" and what it means to be in His presence.

In Acts, we witness the martyrdom of St. Stephen. As he is being stoned, he gazes into heaven and sees the glory of God. Even in his suffering, he recognizes the divine presence and submits himself entirely to God. His reverence is absolute. Contrast this with how we sometimes behave in church - distracted, indifferent, unaware that we stand before the same God who revealed Himself to Stephen.

And in Revelation, we hear Christ's promise: "Behold, I am coming soon." He reminds us that He is the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. He invites us to drink freely from the water of life. But how can we accept this invitation if we do not recognize the One who calls us? How can we prepare for His coming if we treat His house as ordinary?

My dear friends, the church is not just a building - it is the dwelling place of God among His people. When we enter, we step into sacred ground. Let us not be careless or indifferent. Let us approach with reverence, with hearts open to knowing God more deeply. Let our actions reflect our awareness that we stand before the Almighty.

May we, like Stephen, lift our eyes to heaven and truly see the glory of God. May we, like the faithful in Revelation, respond to Christ's call with eager hearts. And may we, as Jesus prayed, be united in Him, recognizing His presence in His house and in our lives.

- The "birthday" of the Church happened at Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit came upon the Apostles and they began to courageously preach about Jesus.
- "Part of the genius of Christianity was that it did not shrink from the horrible way in which Jesus' public life ended by actually placed it at the very center of the faith [the cross]."
- The Jews believed that God providentially guided humanity through history, and Christianity expanded this belief, "which taught that the ultimate meaning of history is the unfolding of the kingdom, and that, since nothing is independent of God's rule, good must ultimately triumph over evil."
- The early Christians believed that Christ was the New Adam who could set humanity free from sin and death.
- St. Paul professed that the Church is "Christ's own Body, of which all believers are members, organically linked to one another and to Christ as their Head."
- "The Christians met regularly on their new Sabbath—
 the first day of the week, the day of the Resurrection—
 for prayers and the 'breaking of the bread', which soon
 came to be called the Eucharist. In the Eucharist, the
 worshippers offered themselves to God and
 participated in the sacrifice of Jesus, the Lamb of
 God, sharing in both His death and His Resurrection,
 their earthly gifts transformed into heavenly ones."
- Baptism and the Sacraments were present from the beginnings of the Church.
- Before the Gospels were written, the "message was kept alive by traditions, most of them probably oral, within the living community of the Church."
- "The infant Church could therefore be considered *charismatic*...in that it was guided by direct divine inspiration, manifested through inspired individuals."
- The early Church had ecclesial offices like bishops, priests, and deacons.
- "Because Jesus condemned the values on which 'the world' is based, His followers were revolutionaries in a far deeper sense than the merely political, preaching a fundamental change in human nature itself, the inward adoption of a way of life that would radically transform the world. This way of life was possible not by human effort alone, but by the grace Christ won for man and offered through His Church, which He commanded his Apostles to spread throughout the world."

Saint Boniface

Feast: June 5

Patron of brewers, Germany, World Youth Day

Quick Facts


- Born in 675, from England
- Known also as Winfrith and the Apostle of Germany.
- He was a scholar, teacher, and priest, but he felt called to missionary work.
- Went to Friesland (present day Holland) to work with a missionary named Willibrord.
- But Radbod, the ruler of Friesland, had declared war on Christians and forced them into hiding. Boniface was defeated in his mission and returned to England a short while later.
- Boniface spent time planning his next mission, and first traveled to Rome to get the support of the pope.
- Pope Gregory II finally agreed to send him to Thuringia in Germany. While there, he learned that the ruler of Friesland had died, so he went back there to learn from Willibrord.
- Went to Hesse where he struck down a tree to the god Thor, and it split into the shape of a cross.
- Spent his life on various missions in Germany, learning from his first experience to get support from the pope and other clergy.
- Was martyred on the way back to Friesland in 754.

Saint Norbert

Feast: June 6

Quick Facts

- Born at Xanten in the Rhineland around 1080.
- Initially pursued a life of pleasure, and loved being a part of the German court and the pleasures and fun it offered.
- While on a journey from Xanten, he was caught in a thunderstorm. Lightning spooked his horse, and Norbert was knocked to the ground unconscious.
- When he awoke he asked, "Lord, what do you want me to do?" God answered him that he should turn from evil and do good.
- From then on Norbert lived a radically different lifestyle. He traveled barefoot, and gave his possessions to the poor.
- Established a community in Prmontr.
- Became a bishop and an archbishop.
- When two men claimed to be the pope, Norbert supported Innocent II, the first pope to be elected. He strove to preserve the unity of the Church.
