Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Today, as we celebrate Pentecost, we reflect on the inspiration of the Holy Spirit – the Advocate sent to guide us into truth. Yet, we must approach this gift with humility and discernment, for not every voice we hear in our hearts is truly His.

In the Gospel of John, Jesus appears to His fearful disciples, offering peace and breathing upon them, saying, "Receive the Holy Spirit." This marks the beginning of their mission, yet the Spirit is given within their community, not as a private possession. The Spirit empowers them, but it does not encourage personal, untested revelations. Instead, it strengthens their apostolic mission and leads them to unity in faith.

In Acts, the Spirit descends at Pentecost, filling the apostles with divine strength to proclaim the mighty works of God. They speak in different languages, revealing that the Spirit's inspiration is not isolated but directed toward the mission of the Church. Their message aligns with Christ's teaching, and their authority comes from their unity as the Church's foundation.

Saint Paul reminds us that "no one can say, 'Jesus is Lord,' except by the Holy Spirit." The Spirit manifests in different ways, but always for the common good, leading us deeper into truth without contradicting Christ or the Church. True inspiration aligns with sacred teaching and strengthens unity in faith, rather than fostering division or confusion.

Thus, discernment is essential. We must examine our inspirations against Sacred Scripture, Sacred Tradition, and the Magisterium. Only when they align with these foundations can we be assured that we follow God's will. Personal emotions or convictions alone are not enough; they must be tested against what has been revealed through Christ and His Church. When we hear a voice prompting us, we must ask: Is this truly the Holy Spirit, or is it simply our own desires speaking?

The Holy Spirit never leads us into contradiction. The Spirit does not tell one believer one thing and another person something entirely different. He speaks in harmony with Christ and His Church, reinforcing the truth handed down through the generations. Whenever we feel uncertain, we must turn to prayer, seek counsel from the wisdom of the Church, and rely on the guidance of those entrusted with teaching the faith.

As believers, we are called to be open to the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, but we are also called to be vigilant. True faith does not rely on impulsive feelings but on the firm foundation of Christ's teachings. May we always seek the truth in Christ, discerning carefully, and walking in the light of His revelation. May the Spirit guide us, not into personal whims but into truth and unity.



June is the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

After daily Mass each day in June, we will pray the Litany to the Sacred Heart.

Copies of the prayer can be found at the church entrances or online.

The Litany was approved by Pope Leo XIII in 1899, and is a compilation of other novenas. The 33 invocations coincide with the 33 years of our Lord's life on earth.

Praying this Litany with a sincere heart can earn a partial indulgence.

- The Apostles first began preaching to the Jews by "announcing that the old faith was not abolished but actually fulfilled in Jesus and marshaling the sayings of the prophets in order to show that their words foretold the coming of Jesus."
- Many Jewish authorities did not take well to the Christians' claim that they "understood Scripture better than the Jews did," and many of the Apostles were imprisoned and eventually martyred. James was killed by Herod, and Stephen, considered the first martyr, was stoned.
- One of the most important disciples of the early Church was St. Paul, who experienced a vision of Jesus and converted to Christianity after having been one of the ones who persecuted the Christians. Paul believed that the Gospel was meant to be spread throughout the world.
- Many Jews were scattered throughout the Roman Empire, which helped to spread the Gospel message to Gentiles as well as Jews.
- Paul made several missionary journeys throughout the Mediterranean, and wrote letters to the local communities (these became the Epistles).
- The first big issue surrounding doctrine of the Church was when Peter and Paul disagreed about whether or not Gentiles who became Christians needed to observe the Jewish laws of circumcision and dietary restrictions. They eventually agreed that Christians did not have to follow Jewish laws.
- The temple in Jerusalem was destroyed in 70 A.D., which had been foretold by Jesus. Some saw this as necessary since Jesus is the new Temple.
- Other disciples like St. James, St. Joseph of Arimathea, St. Bartholomew, St. Jude Thaddeus, St. Thomas, and St. Mark spread the Gospel to places such as Spain, Britain, Persia, Mesopotamia, India, and Egypt.
- While the Roman Empire had been responsible for the crucifixion of Jesus, it also served as a means to spread early Christianity. The vast unity of the Empire made it easier for missionaries to travel to far locations to preach. Peter and Paul's martyrdoms at Rome made Rome the seat of the Church (and it still is today).

Feast: June 13 Patron of lost things

Quick Facts

- Born in 1195 in Portugal to a wealthy family; his birth name was Fernando Martins.
- Martins.
 At age 15 asked to go to the Abbey of Santa Cruz. While there he learned theology and Latin.
- Was ordained a priest, and became the guestmaster (in charge of hospitality) at the Abbey. When some Franciscan friars settled near the Abbey, he wanted to join them.
- Changed his name to Anthony after becoming a Franciscan
- Was skilled at preaching in a simple way that people could understand
- When a novice at a Franciscan hermitage stole Anthony's book of psalms, he prayed for its return, and the novice gave it back to him.
- Once tried to preach to some heretics who didn't want to listen to him, so he started talking to the fish. When the fish gathered around him, the people decided that they should also listen to what Anthony had to say.
- Died at age 35 and canonized less than a year later, declared a Doctor of the Church in 1946.
- Over 300 years after his death, his body was exhumed and his tongue was found to be completely incorrupt.
