

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Today's Scriptures speak directly to the heart of anyone who has ever waited – for healing, for direction, for answers. Who among us hasn't cried out in difficult moments, "Lord, when will You act?"

We hear Jesus say in Luke 12:32, "Do not be afraid, little flock, for your Father has been pleased to give you the kingdom." This gentle encouragement reminds us that God's promises are not empty. But His timing? Ah – that's where our faith is truly tested. In the Letter to the Hebrews, we're shown the shining legacy of Abraham and Sarah, who journeyed far from their homeland without knowing their destination, clinging to nothing but God's word. "Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." Though they did not live to see every promise fulfilled, they walked patiently, trusting the One who is eternally faithful. And in the Book of Wisdom, we hear of the Israelites who, with hearts tethered to divine promises, held on through the night of waiting – believing that deliverance would surely come.

Let us be honest: Waiting is hard. It tests our spirit and stretches our trust. But faith is not simply believing in the outcome – it is believing in God Himself, even when the path is uncertain. Even when the promise feels delayed. We are not called to be passive in this waiting. Jesus reminds us to "be dressed ready for service and keep your lamps burning," like servants expecting their master. This is not anxious waiting – it is hopeful readiness. It means living each day as if the promise might be fulfilled tomorrow, even if it takes a lifetime.

Patience rooted in faith does not mean resignation. It means surrender to love. God's plan, mysteriously beautiful, unfolds not according to our timeline, but His. And what a comfort that is. For it means we are guided not by chaos, but by grace. So, if you are waiting for healing, for reconciliation, for purpose, take heart. You stand in the company of saints and pilgrims. Faith is your lamp in the night. Patience is the path and God is both the destination and the companion.

Never forget: He is faithful. His promises are true. And everything, even the waiting, is part of your story with Him. As the Book of Wisdom reminds us, "the saints secretly shared the same good things" – and so do we. Even now. Even in the waiting.



Modern Church History part 2 (Next Week)

- Typically the modern era is considered to begin around the 1700s with the Renaissance and Enlightenment.
- Catholic author George Weigel describe modernity as "societies characterized by the decline of aristocratic authority based on inherited power and land-based wealth...the sharp differentiation of religious and political authority...industrialization, urbanization, and mass education; social mobility; popular participation in government...rise in life expectancy; and a vast expansion of leisure time available to everyone."
- In other words, governments became more democratic with elected officials rather than royalty or nobility inheriting power, and religious and political power began to separate. Up until the modern era, the Catholic Church had been prominently involved in political affairs, but this was about to change.
- Much of the land of Italy was ruled by the pope, called the Papal States. Popes Gregory XVI and Pius IX believed that the life of the Church depended on having control of the Papal States, which ended up not being true.
- The French Revolution was largely a rebellion against the Church being in charge of France's government. Philosophers like Voltaire believed that the Church was the enemy of freedom, justice, and reason.
- "Throughout continental Europe, the formation of the modern nation-state was typically undertaken against the Catholic Church." (Weigel)
- The Ultramontanism movement in France sought to fight against the Enlightenment and wanted a renewal of the union of the Church and the state.
- Eventually the Church lost control of the Papal States and ended up with a small section of Italy known as Vatican City. But George Weigel argues that "the demise of the Papal States would prove to be the essential condition for the possibility of the papacy exercising politically effective moral authority in the twentieth century."
- The First Vatican Council in 1869 defined papal infallibility as relating to only formal declarations of the pope concerning matters of faith and morals.
