

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

"I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!" These words from Jesus in today's Gospel can sound startling, even unsettling. We often imagine Christ as the Prince of Peace, the gentle Shepherd, the healer of wounds. And yet here He speaks of fire and division – of households torn apart, of conflict not peace. But this is not a contradiction. It is a revelation.

Jesus does not desire division. He does not wish for families to be fractured or hearts to be burdened. Rather, He is naming the inevitable consequence of truth entering a world that has grown comfortable with compromise. The fire He brings is the fire of divine love, of purification, of truth that cannot coexist with falsehood. And in a world that often prefers shadows to light, truth will always provoke a reaction. We live in a dualistic world – a world where good and evil are not abstract ideas but daily realities. We know kindness because cruelty exists. We know peace because we have tasted conflict. And we know the beauty of Christ because we have seen what life looks like without Him.

Jeremiah, in our first reading, is thrown into a cistern for speaking the truth. He is not hated because he is wrong, but because he is right. His fidelity to God's word makes him a threat to those who would rather silence the voice of conscience than change their hearts. This is the pattern of the prophets. And it is the pattern of Christ. When Jesus says He came to bring fire, He is speaking of the fire that refines, not destroys. It is the fire of the Holy Spirit, the fire of conviction, the fire that burns away complacency and awakens courage. And yes, it divides - not because Christ is divisive, but because truth demands a response. Some will embrace it. Others will resist it. Even within families, this tension can arise. Faith is not inherited like a surname. It is chosen, lived, and sometimes suffered for.

The Letter to the Hebrews encourages us to run the race with perseverance, keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus. He endured opposition from sinners, not because He failed, but because He was faithful. And we, too, are called to endure – not with bitterness, but with hope. Opposition is not necessarily a sign that we are on the wrong path. It is often the clearest sign that we are walking with Christ. The world resisted Him. It will resist us. But we do not walk alone.

So, what do we do when we feel the sting of rejection, the loneliness of standing for truth, the ache of division even among those we love? We remember this: Christ has gone before us. He knows the pain. He knows the cost. And He promises that it is not in vain. The fire we endure now is not the fire of destruction - it is the fire that leads to eternal life. It is the fire that purifies our hearts, strengthens our resolve, and prepares us for the joy that no opposition can steal.

In today's second reading, we hear the author of the letter to the Hebrews liken the daily life of the Christian steward to a race, a long-distance race perhaps, certainly not a sprint; requiring endurance and a single-minded focus on Jesus at the finish line. Good stewards are firmly committed to running the race, to live the Christian life to the fullest, to keep their eyes focused on Jesus. They don't grow weary. They don't lose heart. Going backwards? Going nowhere? Some of us may want to reflect on what we can do to run the race with even more conviction. 

- Popes Gregory XVI and Pius IX were in general opposed to most of the ideas of modernity; they thought "that it was more important to play good defense against these intellectual assaults on Catholicism than to go on offense and propose Catholic answers to the quandaries of the age."
- However, there were those who wanted to build bridges between Catholicism and modernity: "to replace a Catholicism bent on rejecting modernity root and branch with a Church exploring modernity in the hope of converting it." One of these was St. John Henry Newman.
- "Catholicism in America in the mid-nineteenth century was demonstrating that the Church could flourish under the conditions of modernity while remaining loyal to Catholicism's center of authority in Rome."
- Pope Leo XIII "was the pivotal figure...who would set the Church on the road to [an] exploration of modernity...[which would] accelerate the process by which the Catholic Church rediscovered its evangelical essence while becoming an intellectual force capable of engaging in a serious, critical, and history-changing conversation with modernity."
- Leo XIII wanted to help the Catholic Church to engage with the modern world in the hopes of transforming it. He also embraced the ideas of St. Thomas Aquinas, whose philosophy he thought was ideal for engaging with the modern world.
- Leo XIII believed that for a society to flourish and meet the needs of human beings, society, politics, and economics must be rooted in "the deep truths of the human condition." He said that these truths are revealed in the natural law which anyone had the ability to access. He also said that "freedom is the human capacity to know what is truly good, to choose it freely, and to do so as a matter of habit or virtue." The goal of societies should be to protect that freedom; society comprised of many communities, from the family to the state.
- Leo's encyclical *Rerum Novarum* laid out the foundations of Catholic social theory. 1. The inherent dignity of each individual person should guide the decisions and actions of society. 2. Individual rights should be exercised in such a way that all are free to contribute to the well-being of society.

- She often undertook severe physical penances, including wearing a silver crown with spikes.
- A story says that she accurately predicted the date of her death.
- Died at age 31 and was canonized in 1671

- Born to noble parents in France
- Studied theology and Scripture at a college in Chatillon, and was known for his piety.
- Joined the new Cistercian Order after the death of his mother.

- Founded other monasteries and took many iourneys
- Was called upon by Pope Eugene III to preach about the Second Crusade.
- Died in 1153 and is a Doctor of the Church.
