

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Today's readings are not gentle. They do not soothe us with soft promises or easy paths. Instead, they confront us with the reality of struggle, of discipline, of the narrow gate – and they ask us to see these not as punishments, but as gifts.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells us to "strive to enter through the narrow gate." That word "strive" is not passive. It's not "wait patiently" or "coast comfortably." It's agonizomai in Greek, the root of our word "agony." It's the language of athletes straining in competition, of soldiers in battle, of saints in prayer. Jesus is saying: the path to salvation is not wide and well-paved. It is narrow, and it demands effort. But why would God make the gate narrow? Why not fling it open wide?

The answer, I believe, is found in the second reading from Hebrews. "Do not disdain the discipline of the Lord," it says. "For whom the Lord loves, He disciplines." And again: "At the time, all discipline seems a cause not for joy but for pain, yet later it brings the peaceful fruit of righteousness." This is the spiritual equivalent of physical training. Anyone who's ever trained for a marathon, recovered from injury, or simply tried to get back in shape knows: growth hurts. Muscles ache. Breath shortens. You sweat, you strain, you want to quit. But the pain is not a sign of failure — it's a sign of transformation. The body is being stretched beyond its comfort so that it can become stronger. So it is with the soul.

God allows us to experience trials, not to break us, but to build us. Not to punish, but to purify. The narrow gate is not a trap; it's a threshold. And the discipline we endure is not rejection; it's preparation. Isaiah gives us the vision of what lies beyond that gate: a gathering of all nations, all tongues, all peoples. God sends messengers to the ends of the earth, not to condemn, but to call. And He promises to take even some of them – outsiders, foreigners – and make them priests and Levites. That's radical. That's grace. But grace doesn't mean ease. It means transformation. And transformation requires surrender.

When we face hardship – whether it's illness, conflict, loneliness, or spiritual dryness – let us not complain as though God has abandoned us. Let us not say, "Why me?" as though suffering were meaningless. Instead, let us say, "Lord, what are You training me for?" Let us ask, "What strength are You building in me?" Let us trust that the pain is not pointless, but purposeful. Because the narrow gate is not closed. It is open – but it requires strength to enter. And God, in His mercy, is giving us that strength through every challenge we face.







All About Vatican II (Next Week)

- Pope Pius X set about to reform aspects of Catholic life such as the liturgy, catechesis, and seminary education. He said that all the faithful should receive Holy Communion as often as possible. He also lowered the age of reception of 1st Communion from 14 to 7.
- Pius X rejected the evils of modernism, and in general was less engaged with modernity than Leo XIII.
- Pope Pius XI fought against totalitarian regimes like Mussolini's dictatorship in Italy. He believed that local governments should first have responsibility for the people closest to them, not the federal government. The United States' system of local, state, and federal governments is a good example of this, called "subsidiarity." "It is the responsibility of the highest authority, the national authority, to respect the prerogatives of and provide help to the 'lower authorities.""
- Pius XI gave everything he had to fight against fascism and Nazism.
- Pope Pius XII, elected in 1939, issued the encyclical *Mystici Corporis Christi*, in which he said that the Church is "Christ's living body in the world," and that grace "empowers the Church for its mission in the world, which is a mission of conversion." (Weigel)
- Pius XII's encyclical *Mediator Dei* encouraged "active lay participation at Mass, for laypeople offer themselves to God in union with Christ when the Eucharist is celebrated in community." He also "described the liturgy as the vital center of Catholic life and mission and called all Catholics to make the rhythms of the Church's worship and liturgical year the pattern of their lives and religious practices." Many of Pius XII's ideas laid the groundwork for Vatican II.
- Pius XII also argued that government should include "virtuous leadership" that promoted an "equality of responsibility" in which citizens were free to follow moral law.
- Contrary to popular belief, Pius XII did advocate for the Jews during World War II, but exercised caution so as not to encourage the Nazis to kill even more Jews.
- It is also false that Pius XII and the Church helped to shield Nazi war criminals after the war. The Church always condemned Nazism, even if a few Catholics supported it.
