

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Free Will

There's a moment in the desert when the Israelites are tired — not just physically, but spiritually. They've grown impatient with God, resentful of the journey, and bitter toward the manna that once felt miraculous. And in that moment, serpents appear. Not as punishment, but as revelation. The venom exposes their vulnerability. The bite reveals their need. And God's response? He doesn't remove the serpents. He tells Moses to lift up a bronze image of the very thing that afflicts them. Healing won't come by hiding from the wound — it will come by facing it. By looking up. By trusting.

The Cross is not a scandal – it's a mirror. It reveals the venom of sin and the antidote of mercy.

Centuries later, Jesus tells Nicodemus: "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up." And suddenly, the Cross is not a scandal – it's a mirror. It reveals the venom of sin and the antidote of mercy. It shows us what love looks like when it's nailed down and refuses to run. But here's the deeper mystery: the Cross is not inevitable. It's chosen. Jesus, though He was in the form of God ... He emptied Himself. He didn't stumble into Calvary – He walked there. Freely. Obediently. Lovingly.

But here's the deeper mystery: the Cross is not inevitable. It's chosen.

And that brings us to the question: are we destined, or do we have free will? The Cross answers: we are loved, and we are free. God's foreknowledge is not a rigid script. It is the perfect awareness of every possibility, every path, every choice we might make – and the consequences of each. He sees the full

landscape of our freedom, and yet He never forces our hand. His knowledge is not control — it is compassion. He knows our hearts, our wounds, our wanderings, and still, He waits for our 'yes'. Faith, then, is not surrender to fate. It is trust in a God who knows us fully and still invites us freely.

God's foreknowledge is not a rigid script. It is the perfect awareness of every possibility, every path, every choice we might make – and the consequences of each.

And when we say yes, we say it to a Savior who is both divine and human. Not half of each. Fully both. The Son of God became the Son of Man – not to observe us, but to rescue us. Because only a true human could stand in our place. And only true divinity could conquer death. Jesus is the New Adam – not grasping at glory, but surrendering to love. Where Adam hid in shame, Christ hangs in mercy. Where Adam brought exile, Christ brings homecoming.

The Son of God became the Son of Man – not to observe us, but to rescue us. Because only a true human could stand in our place. And only true divinity could conquer death. Jesus is the New Adam – not grasping at glory, but surrendering to love.

So today, we are invited to look up. Not just with our eyes, but with our lives. To gaze upon the Cross and see not fate, but freedom. Not condemnation, but communion. Not inevitability, but intimacy. The Cross stands before us, not as a relic, but as a choice. Will we trust? Will we surrender? Will we let love lift us?



THE TAKE-AWAYS

- The Liturgy of the Hours is also known as the Divine Office or the Work of God.
- It is the daily prayer of the Church which marks the hours of each day with prayer.
- The Hours are "a meditative dialogue on the mystery of Christ, using scripture and prayer."
- Clergy, religious, and lay people may pray the Liturgy of the Hours. The laity are encouraged to pray the Divine Office.
- There are five Hours of the Divine Office:
 - 1. **Office of Readings:** the readings proclaimed at Mass that day.
 - 2. Morning Prayer: one of the most important prayers of the Divine Office, includes a hymn, prayers from the Psalms, the Canticle of Zechariah, and intentions.
 - 3. Daytime Prayer: can be prayed at midmorning, midday, midafternoon, or all three. These are shorter prayers meant to be said during the work of the day, and the times also align with Christ's Passion in the Gospels.
 - 4. Evening Prayer: the other most important prayer of the Divine Office, includes the Canticle of Mary (the Magnificat)
 - 5. Night Prayer: also known as Vespers, said before bedtime, even if it is after midnight


