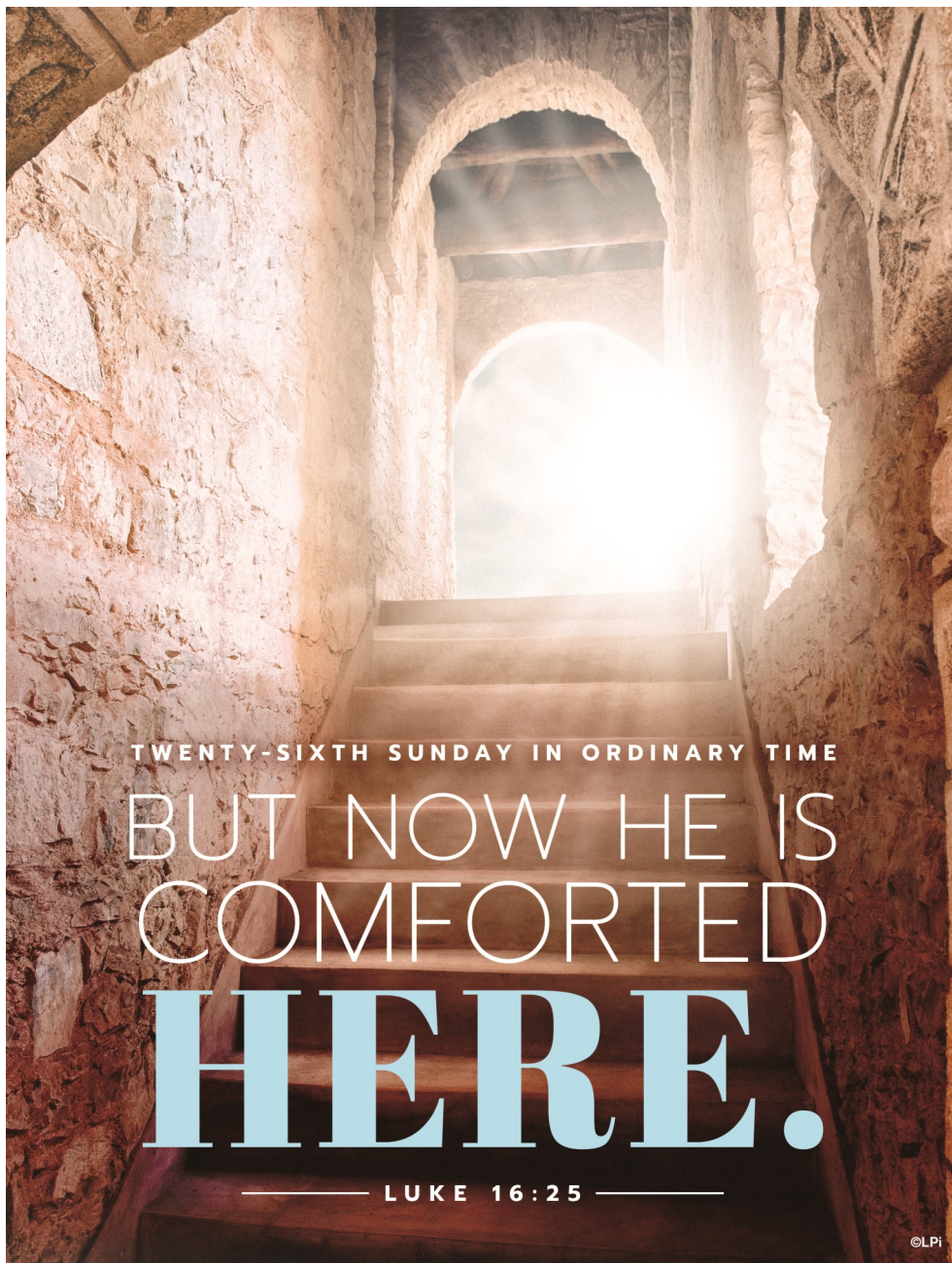

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

The Communion of Saints and the Dignity of Life

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the story of a rich man and a poor man named Lazarus. The rich man lives in comfort, ignoring Lazarus who suffers just outside his gate. After death, their roles reverse: Lazarus is comforted, and the rich man is tormented. Between them, a great chasm is fixed.

The parable invites us to ask: "Do we live as if we belong to one another, or as if we are isolated?"

This chasm isn't just about wealth. It's about communion. The rich man lived as if he were alone, blind to the suffering at his doorstep. Lazarus, though unseen in life, is now embraced in eternal fellowship. The parable invites us to ask: "Do we live as if we belong to one another, or as if we are isolated?"

Those who have died in Christ are not gone, they are alive in Him. The saints intercede for us. We pray for the dead. Love is not extinguished by death; it is fulfilled.

The Church answers with the beautiful truth of the *Communion of Saints*. We are part of a living fellowship that spans heaven, purgatory, and earth. Those who have died in Christ are not gone, they are alive in Him. The saints intercede for us. We pray for the dead. Love is not extinguished by death; it is fulfilled. So, when we ask, "Will we see our loved

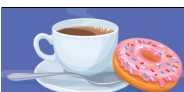
ones who remain on earth after we pass?" the answer is yes. Not in earthly sight, but in spiritual communion. We remain united in grace, and we await reunion in the fullness of God's kingdom.

And Jesus shows us that eternity begins now, in the way we treat the Lazarus at our gate.

This communion also shapes how we face suffering and death. Amos warns against complacency. Paul urges Timothy to *fight the good fight of faith*. And Jesus shows us that eternity begins now, in the way we treat the Lazarus at our gate. When illness comes, the Church teaches that life is sacred, but not to be preserved at all costs. Catholics are morally obliged to accept *ordinary means* of care: treatments that offer real hope and are not overly burdensome. But we may refuse *extraordinary means*, those that are painful, costly, or futile. This is not rejecting life, it's entrusting it to God.

In all things, we are called to live and die with dignity.

In all things, we are called to live and die with dignity. To entrust ourselves not to comfort or control, but to communion. To cross the chasms of indifference with bridges of compassion. The Communion of Saints is not just a doctrine, it's our calling. May we live and die in that communion, and rise in the mercy of Christ.

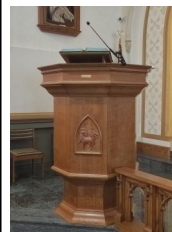
What's What at Mass part 2 (Next Week)

The Sanctuary: Where the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass takes place, includes the altar, high altar, chairs for priests, deacons, and altar servers. Sometimes sectioned off by a railing to indicate its sacredness



The Altar: the table where the Mass is celebrated and the Eucharist is consecrated; is covered by a large cloth.

High Altar: the main altar of the church, usually against the wall of the sanctuary, holds the tabernacle of the Blessed Sacrament



Ambo: Can also be called the pulpit; it is where the readings are proclaimed at Mass; it is raised up so the person standing on it can be easily seen. Some churches will have a separate lectern, a smaller podium that can be moved.

Candles: There are 3 candles on each side of the altar. For ordinary Sunday Masses, two candles on each side are lit. For solemnities, all six candles are lit.

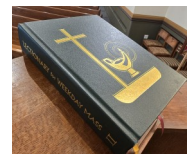


Tabernacle: holds the Blessed Sacrament, resides on the high altar. The sanctuary lamp (red candle) is lit to indicate the presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. The only time the Body of Christ is not in the tabernacle is from the end of Holy Thursday Mass until the Easter Vigil Mass.

Lectionary: contains the readings for Mass; there is a lectionary for daily Mass and a separate one for Sunday Mass



Roman Missal: the book that contains all of the prayers, rubrics, and texts for celebrating Mass. Missals contain all of the prayers and readings for Mass, while a Sacramentary contains the prayers and readings for a single celebration



Evangelary: A large book, often with golden covers and highly ornate, which contains only the Gospels used at Mass. Often when there is a deacon this book will be used for the Gospel reading.

In today's Gospel Jesus offers a warning about living selfishly in his parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus. The Rich Man holds sumptuous feasts and dresses in fine clothes. But despite his affluence he does nothing to relieve the painful hunger and debilitating condition of his neighbor Lazarus. He neglects to love his neighbor as he loves himself and is sent to hell for his lifestyle and desire for self-gratification. The Rich Man represents those who spend their money on their own personal pleasures with no regard for sharing their material possessions with the poor and needy in their own neighborhood. Good stewards realize the practical implications of not only loving God, but loving their neighbor as they would love themselves. Who are the less fortunate in our neighborhood? Do we share a portion of our own blessings with them?
