

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Our Profession of Faith

The Word of God calls us to a faith that does not grow weary. A faith that prays, that proclaims, that perseveres. In Exodus, Moses stands on the hill, arms raised in prayer. As long as his hands are lifted, Israel prevails. But when he grows tired, the battle falters. So, Aaron and Hur come beside him, lifting his arms, holding him up. This is not just a story of intercession, it is a story of faith sustained by community.

Will He find faith in us? Will He find hearts that still believe, still pray, still hope?

In Luke, Jesus tells of a widow who refuses to give up. She knocks, she pleads, she persists. And though the judge is unjust, her perseverance prevails. Jesus tells us this parable so that we might pray always and not lose heart. And then He asks, "When the Son of Man comes, will He find faith on earth?" That question is not just about the end of time, it's about today. Will He find faith in us? Will He find hearts that still believe, still pray, still hope?

Before we speak of sacraments, morality, or prayer, we must first say, "I believe."

In 2 Timothy, Paul urges his young disciple to remain faithful to what he has learned, to cling to the Scriptures, to proclaim the Word in season and out of season. Timothy is called to endure, not just in preaching, but in believing. And this is where the Catechism begins: with the Profession of Faith. Before we speak of sacraments, morality, or prayer, we must first say, "I believe." The Creed is not a checklist, it is a lifeline. It is the story of salvation, the truth of who God is, the anchor of our hope.

And when we grow weary, when prayer feels dry, when ministry feels heavy, it is the Profession of Faith that holds us steady. It is the truth we return to, the light that guides us, the reason we keep going. Moses lifts his hands because he believes God is faithful. Timothy preaches because he believes the Word is true. The widow knocks because she believes someone is listening. And we, too, must believe.

And when we grow weary, when prayer feels dry, when ministry feels heavy, it is the Profession of Faith that holds us steady.

We must believe that God is near, that He hears us, that He is just. We must believe that our prayers matter, that our witness matters, that our faith matters. And when we cannot believe alone, we let others hold us up. We lean on the Church, on the communion of saints, on the Word handed down. This is the beauty of the Profession of Faith, it is personal, but never private. It is communal, but never passive. It is the fuel for prayer, the foundation for endurance, the reason we do not lose heart.

We must believe that God is near, that He hears us, that He is just. We must believe that our prayers matter, that our witness matters, that our faith matters. And when we cannot believe alone, we let others hold us up.

So today, let us renew our "I believe." Let us lift our prayers like Moses' hands. Let us proclaim like Timothy. Let us knock like the widow. Because God we believe in is not unjust. He is not absent. He is not indifferent. He is faithful. He is listening. And He will act.







What's What at Mass: Vestments (Last Week) What's What at Mass: Other Objects

Statues and Windows of St. Peter (Next Week)

Holy Oils: There are 3 types of oils used for the Sacraments. The Oil of the Sick is used for Anointing of the Sick. The Oil of Catechumens is used for Baptism, and the Sacred Chrism is used for Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders.



Holy Water Font: We dip our fingers in the water and bless ourselves when we enter a church; it is a reminder of our baptism.



Aspersorium and Aspergillum: the Aspersorium is a bucket filled with holy water, and the aspergillum is a

long handled wand with a ball on the end with holes in it. The priest (or deacon) uses these to bless the congregation during special Masses like Easter, or to bless sacramentals such as palms on Palm Sunday. The Rite of Sprinkling also reminds us of our baptism.





Vigil Lights: a group of candles in the back or on the side of the church. For a donation to the church, you can light a candle for a special intention.

Thurible (censer): a small metal container that hangs from chains, is used to burn incense. A thurifer (person who holds the thurible) swings the thurible back and forth to release incense into the air. The incense symbolizes our prayers rising up to heaven.





Boat: Holds the unburned incense: the priest scoops incense from the boat into the thurible.

Prie-dieu (sounds like pray-do): a small kneeler with a shelf for your arms or a book. Can be used in an adoration chapel, at a prayer spot, or to receive Holy Communion.



Baldaccino: the canopy that is held over the Monstrance during a Eucharistic procession.

Eucharistic Miracle Spotlight

ZARAGOZA, SPAIN 1427

A married woman went to a Moorish sorcerer for help in making a potion to cure her husband's violent behavior. The sorcerer told her that she needed a consecrated Host. While at Mass, she stole a Host by taking it out of her mouth after having received it. She put it in a box and took it to the sorcerer.

Upon opening the box, the woman and the sorcerer discovered that a little baby surrounded by light had replaced the Host. Afraid, the sorcerer told the woman to burn the box and the baby. She did so, but although the box disintegrated, the baby was unharmed. The woman told the sorcerer what had

happened, and filled with fear and regret, they went to the bishop to confess their sin and be baptized.

The baby was taken in procession from the woman's house to the cathedral, where he was placed on the altar for veneration. The next day, while celebrating Mass, the baby became a Host once more.

STEWARDSHIP CORNER

If we want to know what Jesus' parable is about in today's Gospel, it seems that we don't need to work too hard because Saint Luke tell us right at the beginning: "Jesus told his disciples a parable about their need to pray always and not to lose heart." This parable has often been used to bring comfort to us about our prayer life. But could there be a more challenging message for those who take stewardship seriously? Widows were the poorest and most vulnerable of people in Jesus' time. Oppressive legal and economic structures were the norm. Jesus embraced with great compassion the poor and the marginalized. Could it be that we are also encouraged to pray persistently for the poor, the weak and the vulnerable as we hear their cry for justice? And that we must not lose heart that we can effect change in their lives?
