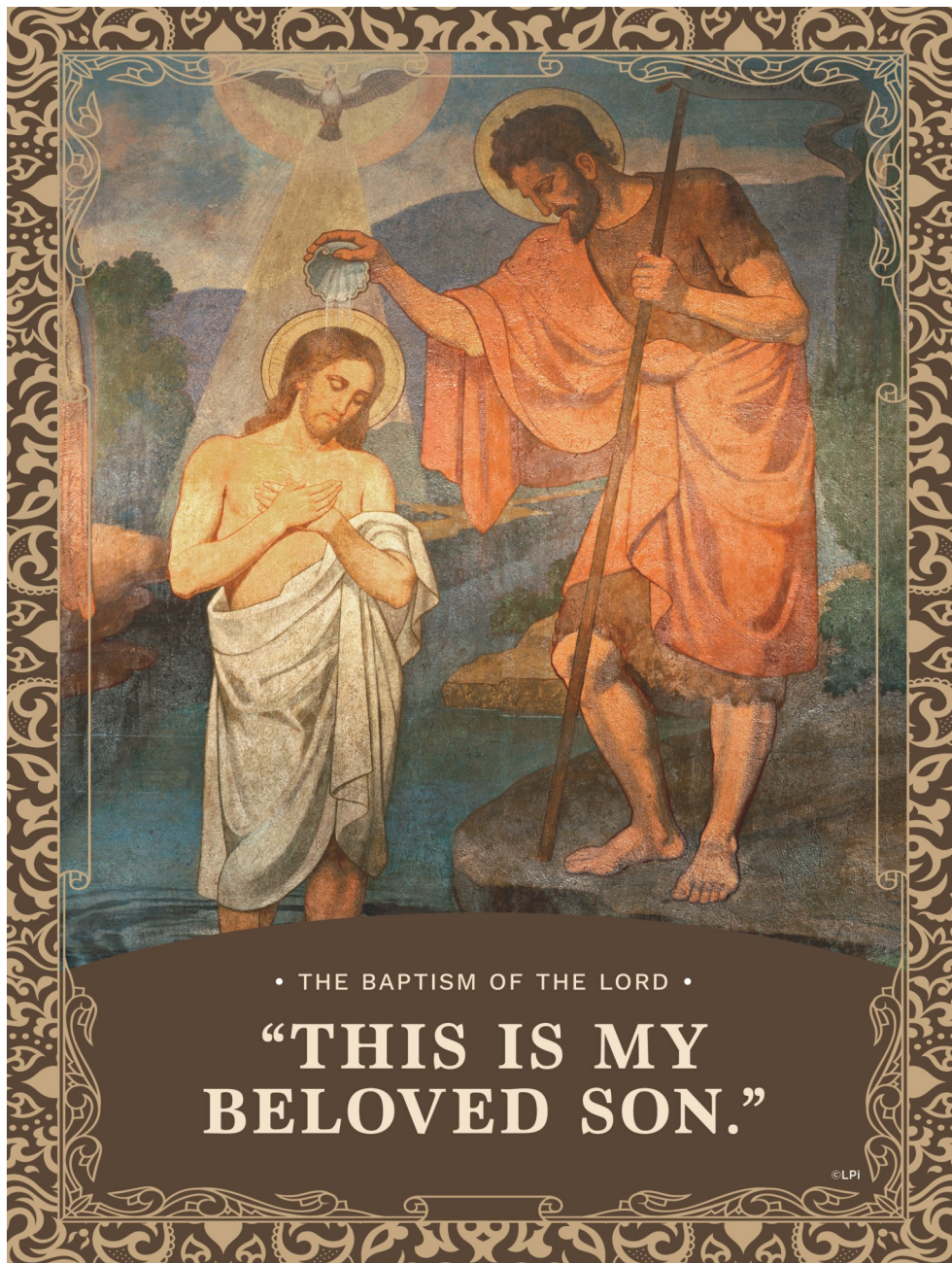

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, a moment that inaugurates Jesus' public ministry. It is a striking scene: the sinless Son of God steps into the waters of the Jordan, where John has been baptizing sinners in repentance. Naturally, we ask: *Why did Jesus need baptism, if He was without sin or blemish?*

The answer lies not in Jesus' need for cleansing, but in His desire for solidarity. By entering the waters, He identifies Himself with us. He who is pure chooses to stand among the impure. He who is holy takes His place beside sinners. In this act, Jesus shows us that He is not a distant Savior, but one who walks with us, sharing our burdens and entering fully into our human condition.

At the Jordan, something extraordinary happens: heaven is opened, the Spirit descends like a dove, and the Father's voice proclaims, *"This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."* The baptism is not for Jesus' sake, but for ours. It reveals His identity to the world. It is the Father's declaration that this man from Nazareth is indeed His divine Son, the one who will bring salvation. In this moment, the Trinity is revealed: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit together in one manifestation of love.

Jesus' baptism also points to His mission. By going down into the water and rising again, He foreshadows His death and resurrection. Just as He will one day descend into the tomb and rise in glory, so here He sanctifies the waters of baptism for us. From now on, baptism is not merely a ritual of repentance, but a sacrament of new life. Through it, we share in His death and resurrection, becoming beloved children of God.

For us, this feast is both comfort and challenge. Comfort, because we know that Jesus has chosen to stand with us in our weakness. Challenge, because baptism is not simply a past event, it is a present day calling. To be baptized is to live as sons and daughters of the Father, to walk in the Spirit, and to carry Christ's mission into the world.

So today, let us remember our own baptism. Let us renew our commitment to live as God's beloved children, filled with the Spirit, and sent forth to bring Christ's light into the world.

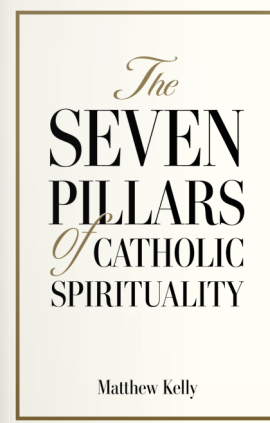
Why 40 Hours?

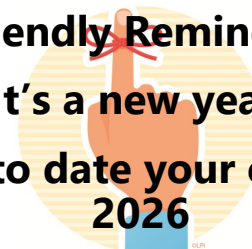

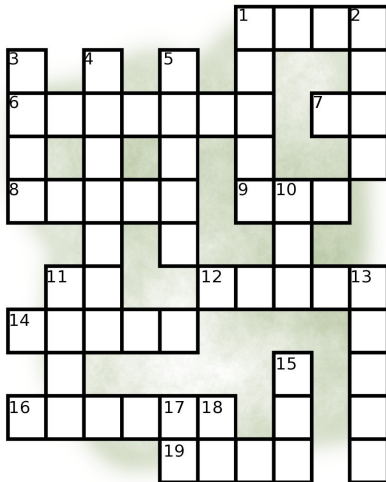

THE TAKE-AWAYS

The Precepts of the Church are essentially the minimum requirements of practicing Catholics.
(see CCC 2042-2043)

1. "You shall attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor." We must attend Mass every Sunday and holy day of obligation. In addition, we should abstain from work on Sundays that gets in the way of our worship to God. Some work is inevitable, but God gave us Sundays as a day to rest our minds and bodies, to spend time with God and with family.
2. You shall confess your sins at least once a year." More frequent reconciliation is highly recommended, but at a minimum you must go to confession once a year. Mortal sins must be confessed before you can receive Communion.
3. You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season." More frequent reception of communion is of course also highly recommended, but you should receive at least once a year during the Easter season.
4. You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church." Those 14 and older are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent. The rest of the Fridays of the year (unless it is a solemnity) are also penitential days, but you can substitute an alternative penance to the abstinence of meat. Those 18-59 are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting and abstinence help us to master our impulses and give us the freedom to follow God with our whole heart.
5. "You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church." The faithful must contribute to the material needs of the Church according to their abilities. This will look different for each person.

FOR DEEPER CONTEMPLATION

"The precepts of the Church are set in the context of a moral life bound to and nourished by liturgical life. The obligatory character of these positive laws decreed by the pastoral authorities is meant to guarantee to the faithful the very necessary minimum in the spirit of prayer and moral effort, in the growth in love of God and neighbor." (CCC 2041)

Quick Facts

- Was a desert hermit who desired to imitate Jesus in everything.
- His parents died when he was 18, leaving him with 300 acres of land and a sister to care for.
- After hearing the Gospel of Matthew at Mass one day, he decided to sell all his possessions and entrusted his sister to a convent.
- Lived for 20 years near a tomb, while people sought him out for talking and healing.
- Eventually there were so many people coming to him that he feared becoming too prideful and them worshipping him instead of God, so he moved out into the desert. He wore animal skins and lived on bread and water.
- Anthony lived to be 105, constantly striving to go one step further in imitating Jesus through prayer and fasting.
