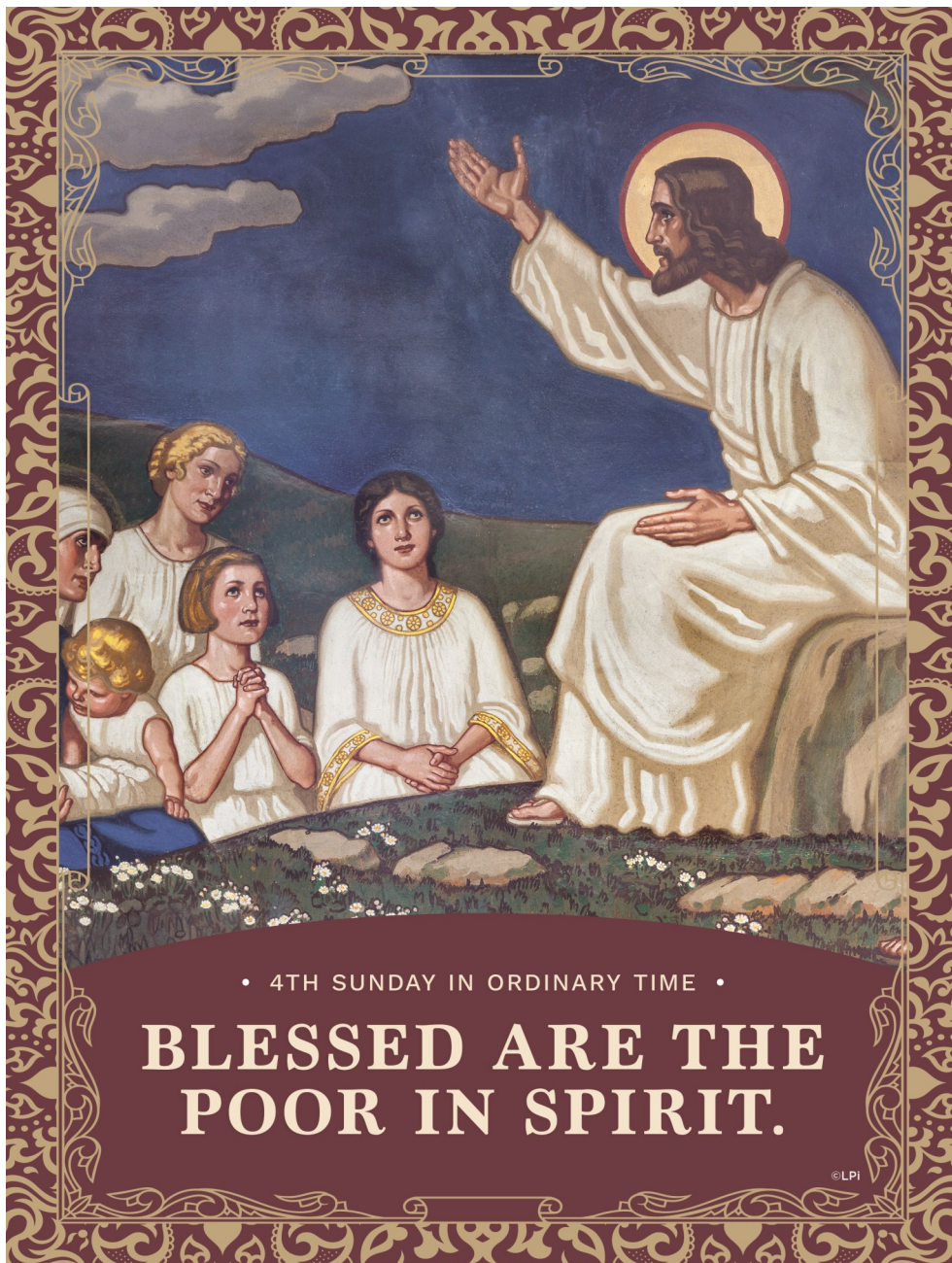

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

A quiet thread runs through all three readings today: God does not see as the world sees. If we forget that, the Beatitudes sound impossible. But once we remember it, the Gospel becomes a revelation of how God works and whom God chooses.

Zephaniah speaks to a people shaken by judgment and loss. Yet God promises to preserve a remnant, not the powerful, not the influential, not the ones who seemed successful. Instead, He keeps *"a people humble and lowly,"* those who seek Him rather than rely on their own strength. In other words, God begins His saving work with the small, the overlooked, the ones who appear insignificant. The world sees weakness; God sees fertile ground for grace.

St. Paul makes the same point to the Corinthians. He invites them to look honestly at their own community: *"Not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth."* And yet these are the ones God chose. Why? So that no one can boast before Him, and so that the world learns that salvation is God's work, not ours. God overturns our categories of importance. What the world calls unimpressive, God calls beloved. What the world dismisses, God raises up.

Then Jesus ascends the mountain and proclaims the Beatitudes, perhaps the clearest expression of God's upside-down vision. He calls "blessed" those whom the world would call unfortunate: the poor in spirit, the meek, the mourning, the persecuted. These are not the people we normally admire. They are not the ones who seem to be winning at life. Yet Jesus insists that they are closest to the Kingdom.

Why? Because they are the ones who have room for God. The proud and self-sufficient often have no space left for grace. But the poor in spirit know their need. The meek do not cling to control. The mourning understand the fragility of life. The persecuted cling to Christ because everything else has been stripped away. These are the hearts God can fill.

The readings challenge us to examine our instincts. How often do we judge our lives, or the lives of others, by worldly standards? How often do we assume that success means God's favor, or that suffering means God's absence? Christ warns us not to be deceived. God's gaze penetrates deeper than appearances. His blessings often come disguised as weakness, dependence, or trial. His chosen ones are often those the world overlooks.

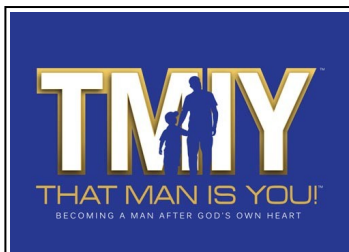

Sin and Its Kinds (Last Week)

The Seven Deadly Sins

A Guide to Making a Good Confession (Next Week)

The Seven Deadly Sins are also called Capital Sins because "they rule over our other sins and are the causes of them." Predominant sins are the sins "into which we fall most frequently and which we find it hardest to resist."

Pride: "An excessive love of our own ability; so that we would rather sinfully disobey than humble ourselves." Some effects of pride on the soul are "sinful ambition, vainglory, presumption, and hypocrisy." (Opposite virtue: humility)

Covetousness: "an excessive desire for worldly things." Some effects of covetousness on the soul are "unkindness, dishonesty, deceit, and lack of charity." (Opposite virtue: generosity)

Lust: "An excessive desire for the sinful pleasures forbidden by the 6th Commandment." Some effects of lust on our souls are "distaste for holy things, a perverted conscience, a hatred for God" and even a "complete loss of faith." (Opposite virtue: chastity)

Anger: "An excessive emotion of the mind excited against any person or thing, or an excessive desire for revenge." Righteous anger at genuine wrongs or feeling the emotion of anger are not sins; the problem is when we take our anger too far. Some effects of anger on our souls are "impatience, hatred, irreverence, and...the habit of cursing." (Opposite virtue: meekness)

Gluttony: "an excessive desire for food or drink" including drunkenness. Drunkenness deprives a person of the use of his reason. Drunkenness "injures the body, weakens the mind, leads its victim into many vices, and exposes him to the danger of dying in a state of mortal sin." (Opposite virtue: temperance)

Envy: "a feeling of sorrow at another's good fortune and joy at the evil which befalls him." Some effects of envy on our soul are "a lack of charity for our neighbor and produces a spirit of detraction, backbiting, and slander." (Opposite virtue: brotherly love)

Sloth: "laziness of the mind and body, through which we neglect our duties on account of the labor they require." Some effects of sloth on our soul are "a spirit of indifference in our spiritual duties and a disgust for prayer." (Opposite virtue: diligence)
