

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

A common idea in our culture today is this: *Believe whatever you want, just keep it private.* Faith, we are told, is acceptable as long as it stays quiet and invisible. But the readings this Sunday make it clear that this is not the Christian way. The Gospel is not something we hide. It is something we live publicly, through actions that give meaning and light to the world.

Isaiah tells us that our *"light shall break forth like the dawn"* when we feed the hungry, shelter the homeless, and care for the afflicted. These are not private gestures. They are visible acts of mercy that reveal God's compassion. Isaiah is teaching us that faith becomes light only when it becomes action. The Psalm reinforces this: *"The just man is a light in darkness."* Light is meant to be seen. It changes its surroundings. A hidden light helps no one. In the same way, a hidden Christian cannot fulfill the mission God has given.

Saint Paul reminds the Corinthians that his preaching did not depend on impressive words. His witness was simple, humble, and public. Paul's life itself proclaimed Christ. His courage, his perseverance, his charity; these were visible signs of the Gospel at work. The power of God is revealed through a life that others can see.

Finally, Jesus speaks directly to us: *"You are the salt of the earth... You are the light of the world."* Salt only works when it touches food. Light only works when it is exposed. Faith only works when it is lived openly. Jesus is not asking us to be loud or confrontational. He is asking us to be visible. To live in such a way that our choices, our compassion, our integrity, and our courage reveal God's presence. The world may prefer a Church that stays silent, but Christ calls us to a faith that shines.

So today, the Gospel challenges us to reject the idea that faith is a private matter. Our discipleship is meant to be public, not for attention, but for mission. Our lives are meant to give flavor to a world that often feels bland and confused. Our witness is meant to bring light where there is darkness. May our lives this week shine with the light of Christ, so that others, seeing our good works, may be drawn not to us, but to God.







The Seven Deadly Sins (Last Week) How to Make a Good Confession Examination of Conscience part 1 (Next Week)

5 Steps for a Good Confession

1. Examine your conscience.
2. Be sincerely sorry for your sins.
3. Confess your sins to a priest.
4. Resolve to amend your life.
5. After your confession, do the penance the priest assigns.

The Process of Reconciliation

1. "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been [] since my last confession."
2. Tell the priest your sins
3. Priest gives you advice/spiritual direction
4. Priest gives you a penance
5. Say the Act of Contrition
6. Prayer of Absolution

Acts of Contrition

"Oh my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended Thee, and I detest all my sins, because I dread the loss of heaven, and the pains of hell, but most of all because they offend Thee, my God, Who art all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of Thy grace, to sin no more and to avoid the near occasions of sin. Amen."

"My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and in failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy."

Other Guidelines

- Confess the sins you remember. Confessing mortal sins is required, but it is highly recommended to confess venial sins as well. If you forget a sin, it is still forgiven, but you should try to remember it in your next confession.
- Ask the priest to help you if you are nervous.
- Try to perform your penance as soon as possible.

"The sacrament of Penance is a whole consisting in three actions of the penitent and the priest's absolution. The penitent's acts are **repentance, confession** or disclosure of sins to the priest, and the **intention to make reparation** and do works of reparation." (CCC 1491)

"One who desires to obtain reconciliation with God and with the Church, must confess to a priest all the unconfessed grave sins he remembers after having carefully examined his conscience. The confession of venial faults, without being necessary in itself, is nevertheless strongly recommended by the Church." (CCC 1493)
