

## Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Today the Scriptures draw us into a quiet but profound truth: from God's perspective, seeing is not the same as having eyes. Human sight and divine sight do not operate on the same plane. And unless we allow the Lord to reshape our vision, we risk walking through life with open eyes yet closed hearts.

Samuel arrives in Bethlehem with a horn of oil and a prophet's certainty. He believes he knows what a king should look like. The eldest son stands before him, strong, impressive, regal, and Samuel's instinct is immediate: "This must be the one." But God interrupts that certainty with a sentence that echoes through all of salvation history: "*Not as man sees does God see.*" Samuel, holy as he is, cannot yet see what God sees. He looks at height and strength; God looks at humility and faithfulness. Samuel sees the surface; God sees the heart. And so, the youngest son, the one not even initially invited to the meal, becomes the chosen king.

Saint Paul takes that same truth and turns it inward. He reminds the Ephesians that they were once darkness, not merely *in* darkness, but *darkness itself*. And now, through Christ, they have become light. But Paul knows that spiritual sight does not come automatically. It requires a willingness to let the light of Christ expose what hides in the shadows: our habits, our compromises, our sins, our self-deceptions. To see as God sees, we must allow His light to reveal what our natural eyes would rather avoid. True sight is not passive; it is a moral awakening. It is the courage to let Christ illuminate the truth.

And then the Gospel gives us the most striking image of all: a man born blind who sees more clearly than anyone around him. When Jesus approaches him, something in this man recognizes what the Pharisees, with all their learning and eyesight, cannot grasp. As the story unfolds, his physical sight is restored, but something deeper happens: his spiritual vision sharpens. He moves from calling Jesus "*the man,*" to "*a prophet,*" to one "*from God,*" until finally he kneels before Him and says, "*Lord, I believe.*" The Pharisees, meanwhile, remain trapped in their blindness, not because their eyes fail, but because their hearts refuse to see.

The readings converge into a single question for us: How do we see? Do we judge by appearances, as Samuel first did? Do we hide in the shadows, avoiding the light that Paul urges us to embrace? Do we cling to our assumptions like the Pharisees, confident in our vision yet blind to the presence of Christ? Or do we allow Jesus to touch our eyes and our hearts, so that we may recognize Him even in the places where sight fails?







The Nicene Creed part 2 (Next Week)

### “I believe”

- Throughout the centuries, the beginning of the Nicene Creed has begun with “We believe” or with “I believe.”
- The Nicene Fathers used the word *pisteeuomen* (we believe), but as time went by, it often became *pisteuo* (I believe). The Latin translation has always used *Credo* (I believe).
- Currently the creed begins with “I believe,” but in the recent past, it began with “we believe.”
- Bishop Barron: “the ambiguity is eloquent, for there is value in both forms.”
- “We believe” emphasizes the communal nature of the Christian faith; “we believe not only with others but in some cases for others... we believe allows us to find mutual support in our faith.”
- On the other hand, “we believe” can allow us to escape a certain amount of personal responsibility for the faith I profess.
- The word “believe” is what is most important because “real faith is supra-rational, above what reason can grasp.”

### “In one God”

- “The Catholic Church has long maintained that the existence of God can be known through the light of natural reason... ‘his eternal power and divine nature, invisible though they are, have been understood and seen through the things he has made.’” In other words, we can know God exists because of the intricacies and order in what He has created.
- A common secularist and materialist view disputes the existence of God because they claim that reality is only what can be materially observed with the physical senses.
- However, our universe is clearly governed by order, intelligence, and predictable laws (ie gravity). Without these things, scientific experimentation would be impossible.
- “Paul Davies challenged his scientific peers with a simple but penetrating question: Where do the laws of nature come from?”
- “Religion is not only not the enemy of science but in fact the condition for its possibility.”
- God must necessarily be one because otherwise He would be imperfect or lacking in some way, in which case He wouldn’t be God.
