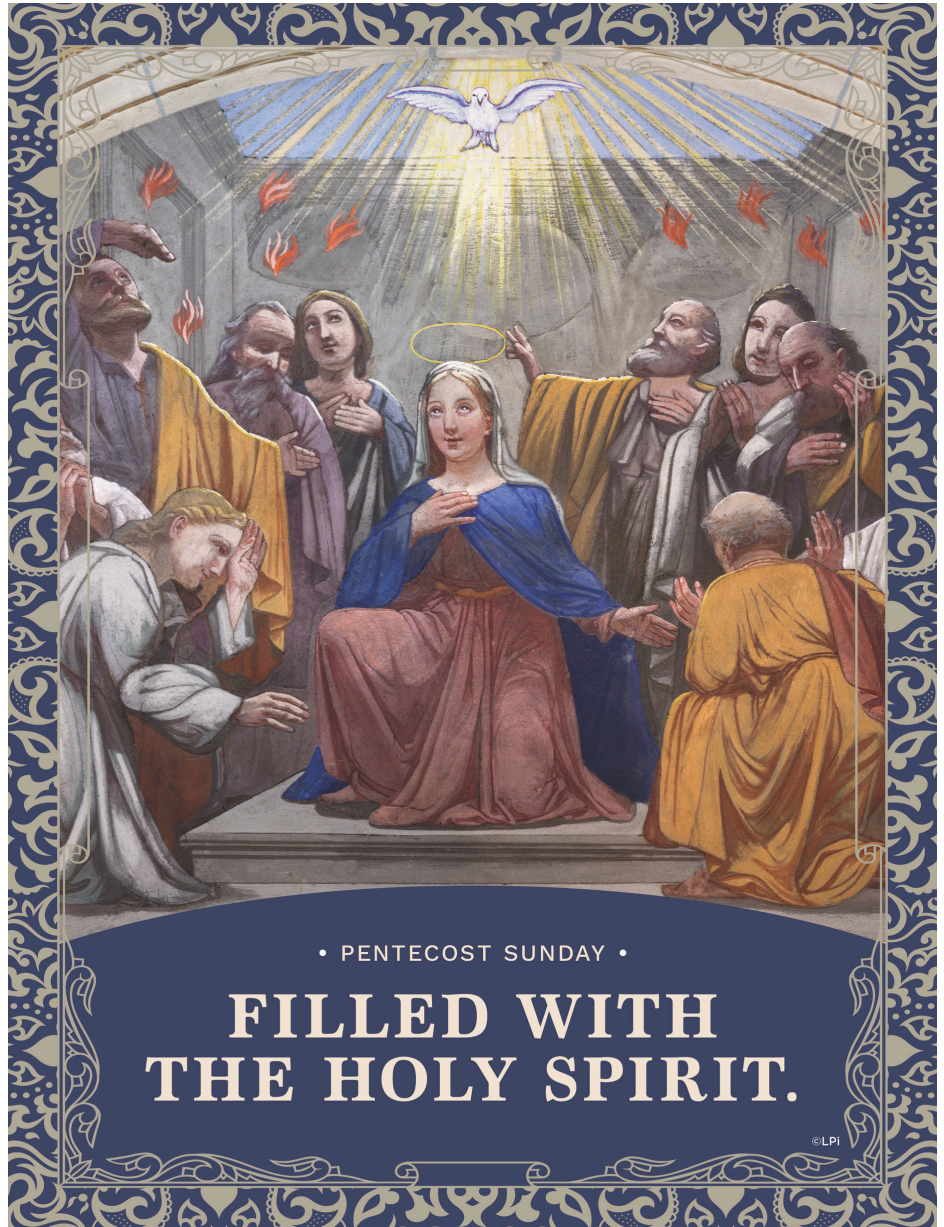

## Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

The Church gives us Pentecost not as a celebration of spiritual fireworks, but as the revelation of God's true intention for His people. Too often, the descent of the Holy Spirit is misunderstood, as if His coming were meant to produce private spiritual experiences, strange utterances, or individual displays of holiness detached from the Body of Christ. But the readings today correct these misconceptions with clarity and force.

In the first reading from Acts, the miracle is not that the apostles spoke "gibberish." The text is explicit: "each one heard them speaking in his own language." The Spirit does not confuse; He clarifies. He does not obscure; He reveals. The Spirit does not create private spiritual codes; He gives a language that reaches the heart. Pentecost – in a way – reverses Babel. Where sin once scattered and divided, the Spirit gathers and unites. The first sign of the Spirit's presence is intelligibility, truth spoken in a way that can be received, understood, and lived.

This is why the Spirit descends upon the Church, not upon isolated individuals. The tongues of fire appear together, resting on each of them, but only while they remain in the same place, in prayer, in communion. The Spirit is never given for private spiritual entertainment. He is given for mission, for proclamation, for the building up of the community. The gifts of the Spirit are ecclesial before they are personal. They are meant to strengthen the Body, not inflate the ego.

Saint Paul reinforces this in the second reading: "To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit." Not for self-display. Not for spiritual superiority. Not for division. The Spirit's gifts are ordered toward the common good, toward unity, service, and the flourishing of the whole Church. If a so-called "gift" isolates, confuses, or elevates the individual above the community, it is not the work of the Holy Spirit.

And then we come to the Gospel, where Jesus breathes on the apostles and says, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them." This is the heart of Pentecost. The Spirit is given not for condemnation but for reconciliation. Not to accuse but to absolve. The first mission entrusted to the Spirit-filled Church is the forgiveness of sins. The Spirit's fire is not a fire that destroys; it is a fire that purifies, heals, and restores.

This is the true purpose of Pentecost: to speak a language that reaches the human heart, to build up the community of believers, to reconcile sinners to God through the ministry of the Church.

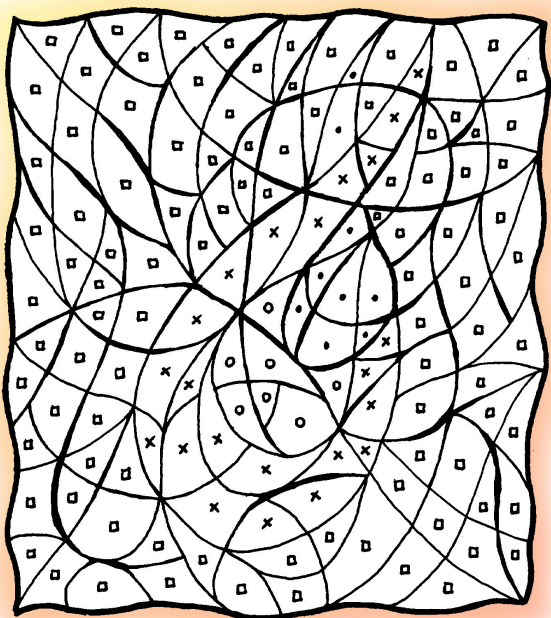

## The Nicene Creed Part 11

### “Who has spoken through the prophets”

- “Like Judaism and Islam, Christianity is a prophetic religion--which is to say, a religion that depends not so much on the rational musings of its adepts, but upon the word uttered by certain distinctive figures who made bold to speak not just *about* God but in the very *name* of God and under his authority.”
- “The prophets of the Old Testament were seized by a power beyond themselves and were commanded to speak, very often against their wills.” Some examples include Jeremiah, Isaiah, Jonah.
- “The prophet does not necessarily foretell the future, though this can be a function of his fundamental mission. His basic task is...to speak God’s judgment on things--which is to say, to evaluate the affairs of the world from the perspective of God and God’s purposes.”
- “The prophets are frequently ahead of their time, for they see where God is tending and hence they push people and institutions beyond their comfortable status quo.” For this reason many prophets were “persecuted, rejected, or put to death.”
- “Prophecy continues, quite obviously, in the New Testament and in the early Church...The Apostles, filled with the Spirit at Pentecost, certainly preached and wrote in the manner of the prophets, and their teaching came, early on, to be established as authoritative in the life of the Church.”
- “The prophetic office, broadly interpreted, includes theologians, teachers, writers, and mystics, who sift through the received teaching of the Church and place it in dialogue with the ever-changing cultural situation. It is precisely this open-ended, sometimes chaotic conversation that prompts the development of doctrine--and to be fair, the corruption of it as well.
- The bishops and the pope operate under the Holy Spirit to help determine what is true doctrine.
- “The teaching of the Church does not emerge as a consensus of the people...comes rather from certain very definite and rare individuals who received the grace to speak from the persepective of God...the doctrine of Christianity does not come ‘from below,’ but rather ‘from above,’ from the Holy Spirit who deigned (and deigns) to speak ‘through the prophets.’”
