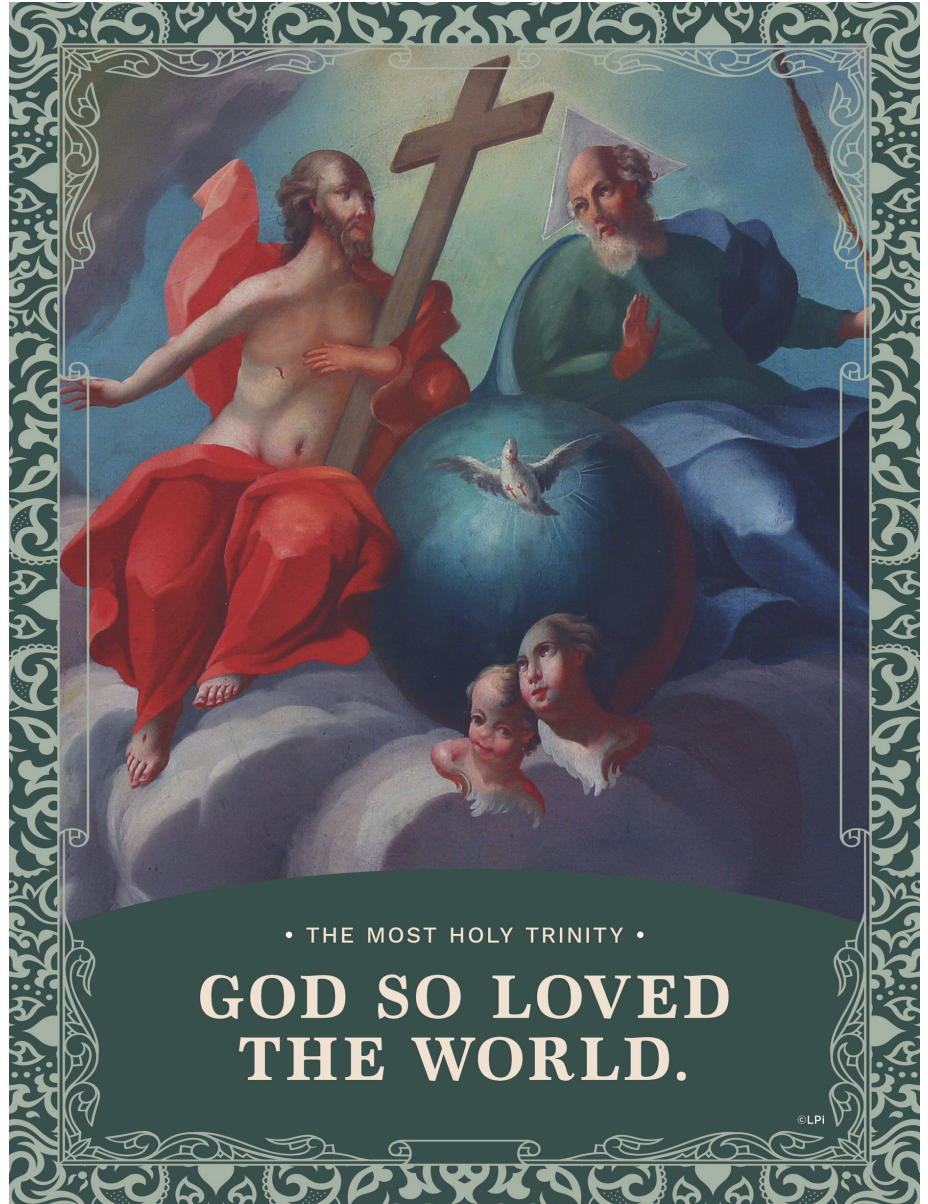

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity invites us into the deepest truth of our faith: God is not a construct we invented, nor an abstract puzzle to solve. God is Someone who reveals Himself. And what He reveals is not theory but reality: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, one God, three Persons, one divine life poured out for us.

In the first reading, Moses encounters God who proclaims His own name: "The LORD, the LORD, a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity." This is not humanity projecting qualities onto the divine. This is God stepping forward and saying, "This is who I am." He is the Creator, the One who sustains all things, the One worthy of worship. The Father is not an idea; He is the source of all being, the One who binds Himself to His people in covenantal love. The Trinity begins here, with God revealing Himself as Lord.

In the second reading, St. Paul blesses the Church with words we can hear at a beginning of Mass: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with all of you." Paul is not offering a poetic flourish. He is naming the lived experience of the early Christians. The Holy Spirit is the Love of God poured into our hearts, the bond of communion, the One who unites us to God and to one another. The Spirit is not an abstraction. He is the Divine Love that makes us capable of loving, forgiving, and belonging. He is the breath of God drawing us into the very life of the Trinity.

And in the Gospel, Jesus reveals the heart of God with a single line: "God so loved the world that He gave His only Son." Here the Trinity becomes unmistakably concrete. The Father gives. The Son comes. The Spirit moves hearts to believe. Jesus is not merely a messenger; He is the eternal Son made flesh, the love of God made visible, the One who dies for our sins and rises to bring us into the life of God Himself.

The Trinity, then, is not an abstract doctrine. It is the practical way God teaches us who He is. The Father creates and calls. The Son redeems and restores. The Spirit sanctifies and unites. This is how God has acted in history, and this is how God continues to act in our lives. And if God is Trinity, then love is not optional. Love is the structure of reality. Love is what God is. Love is what we are made for.

And every time we make the Sign of the Cross, we proclaim the truth that shapes our entire existence: God is love: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and that love has been poured out for us.

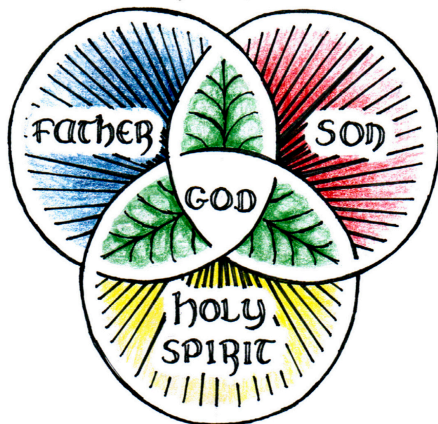
Pro-Life Prayer Ministry

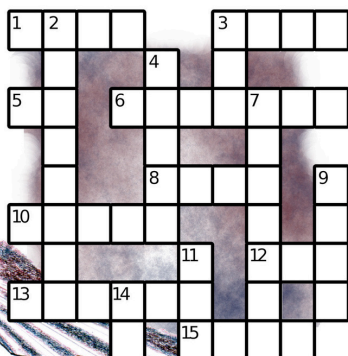

The Nicene Creed part 12

"I believe in"

- "The use of the term "believe" in this context [belief not only in God, but in the institution of the Church] signals perhaps the most fundamental truth regarding the Church--namely, that it is a sacrament of Christ and hence, in a very real fashion, that it participates in Christ's divinity."
- "The glorified and ascended body of Jesus of Nazareth exists now in the realm of God, but the Son of God resolved to take to himself another Body, this one spreading across space and time, made up of all those grafted onto Christ through Baptism."
- The Church is not only an institution, but is truly an "organism," a living instrument "through which Christ [continues] his work in the world."
- "As the Mystical Body of Jesus, the Church is drawn into the inner life of the Trinity, sharing in the oneness enjoyed by the three persons of God...the prolongation of the Incarnation across space and time."
- "If Christ Jesus is Head of this Mystical Body, then all those who are members of it through Baptism are cells, tissues, and organs, interdependently related to one another through him."
- "If the Church is a Body and Christ is the Head, then the Holy Spirit is the soul that animates the Body...The sending of the Spirit, fully expressed on Pentecost, is what made the Mystical Body into a living organism."
- Jesus is the one who calls the members of the Church to himself; we are called from the world, meaning "out of a fallen way of thinking, feeling, perceiving, and behaving." We are called "into the fullness of life and love that will obtain in heaven," a mission to bring the Gospel to the world. The Church doesn't just have a mission; it is a mission.

"One"

- "The Church is one because God is one and God is using the Church to draw the whole human family into the divine life."
- "The oneness of the Church is a function of the Church's identity as Christ's Body."
- In our modern world, we tend to see something that has ultimate authority as being oppressive or aggressive. However, Jesus himself was "the victim of an oppressive political and cultural system, who met his persecutors with nonviolence and forgiving love."
- Also the Church, though one, has a variety of "philosophies, religious practices, and cultural forms."
