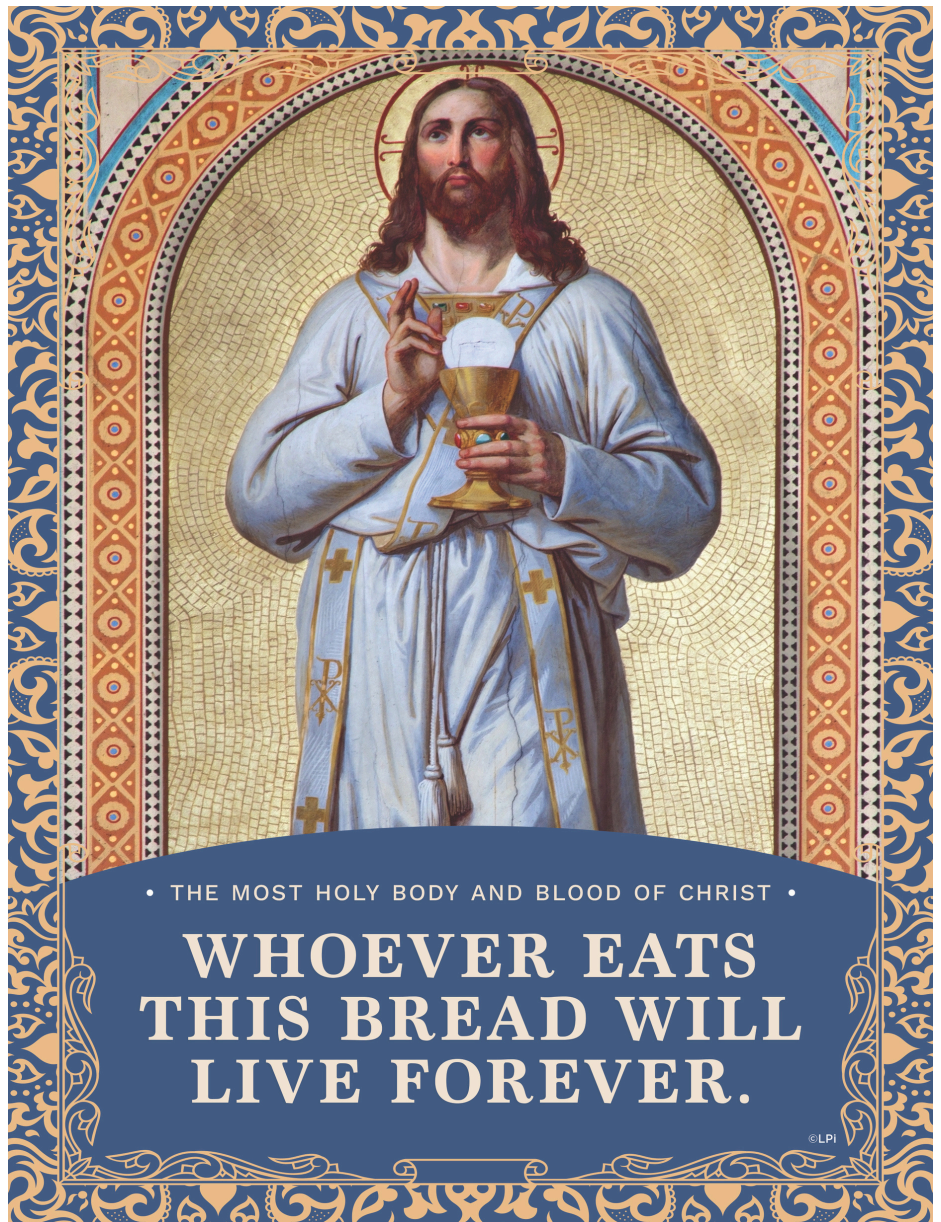

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

On this Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, the Church invites us to reflect on a truth woven throughout Scripture and revealed most fully in the Eucharist: God allows us to experience hunger, struggle, and longing because He already holds the solution, and that solution is always greater than what we imagined.

In the first reading from Deuteronomy, Moses reminds the people that God “let you be afflicted with hunger, then fed you with manna.” At first glance, that sounds strange. Why would a loving God allow His people to hunger? Yet Moses explains the purpose: so that Israel would learn that “not by bread alone does one live, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of God.” Their hunger was not a sign of abandonment. It was a lesson in trust. God allowed them to feel emptiness so they could recognize the miracle of being filled by Him.

And isn't that our story too? We all know what it means to hunger, not only for food, but for meaning, for love, for peace, for forgiveness, for direction. We hunger for a life that makes sense, for relationships that last, for hope that heals. Sometimes we even hunger for God without fully realizing it. And when those hungers rise within us, we may be tempted to think something is wrong, or that God is distant. But Scripture teaches the opposite. Our hunger is often the very place where God prepares to reveal Himself.

In the Gospel, Jesus takes this truth to its fulfillment. The manna in the desert fed Israel for a day, but Jesus offers Himself as the food that gives eternal life. “My flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink,” He says. The hunger God allowed in the desert was only a foreshadowing of the deeper hunger Christ came to satisfy. The manna was a sign; the Eucharist is the reality. The manna sustained earthly life; the Eucharist sustains divine life within us.

God knows our struggles. He knows the burdens we carry, the questions we wrestle with, the emptiness we sometimes feel. But He does not leave us there. Instead, He draws us to this altar, where He gives us not a symbol, not a reminder, but Himself; the One who is the answer to every human longing.

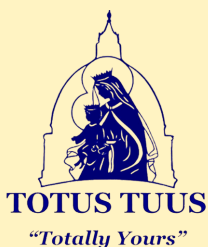

The Nicene Creed part 13

"Holy"

- To be holy means to be set apart. Thus the Church is holy because it is "set apart from any other corporate identity. This sense of the holy as the 'separate' fits well with the notion that the [Church] has been called out of false forms of community into something altogether new and different."
- As a soul makes a person holy, so too does the soul of the Church, the Holy Spirit, make the Church holy.
- "The Church is that community that, having been set apart, participates in the distinctiveness and transcendence of God and thereby brings fullness of life to its members."
- Even though the Church is made up of sinners who can fall into corruption, the holiness of the Church is "not dependent upon the vibrant sanctity and moral excellence of the baptized, but rather upon the Holy Spirit."

"Catholic"

- "The term 'catholic' is derived from the Greek *kata holos* (according to the whole) and thus designates something like universal or all-embracing."
- "The Church of Jesus Christ cannot be limited to any one nation, any single region, any particular ethnic group, or the speakers of any one language exclusively."
- The cross of Jesus "put an end to the animosity based on cultural, ethnic, and religious differences...Hence, the cross of Christ is the matrix of catholicity, the means by which God overcame the divisions of the fallen world."
- The Church "is most especially the place where the tensions produced by these divisions are actively overcome. The Church is an agent and instrument of reconciliation."

"and Apostolic Church"

- "The one, holy, and catholic Church is grounded in the small band of twelve men whom Jesus called to himself and shaped according to his own mind and heart...Christianity is not an abstract philosophical system or a spirituality flowing from personal experience; it is a relationship to the very particular Christ, whose first preachers and mediators were the Twelve."
- The Church is also apostolic in "the passing on of the Apostles' authority from one generation to the next in the persons of bishops."
