Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

We find ourselves today in the middle of the year, both in the calendar and in the liturgical cycle. And the middle is often the hardest place to be. Beginnings come with excitement. Endings come with clarity. But the middle? The middle is where fatigue sets in. The middle is where the initial enthusiasm has worn off, and the finish line still feels far away. Spiritually, emotionally, even physically, the middle is where we are most tempted to slow down, to lose heart, to wonder if the effort is worth it. And right here, in this very moment, God gives us a message meant to strengthen our resolve.

The first reading from Zechariah speaks of a king who comes "meek and riding on a ass," a king who brings peace and banishes the weapons of war. God is telling His people: "I have not forgotten you. I come to you. I come to restore you." It is a gentle reminder that God draws near precisely when we feel worn down.

St. Paul, in the second reading, tells us that we are not slaves to the flesh, not bound to discouragement, weakness, or spiritual exhaustion. The Spirit of God dwells in us. The same Spirit who raised Jesus from the dead is alive in our hearts. Paul is saying: "You have more strength available to you than you realize. Don't give up."

And then Jesus Himself speaks the words our tired souls long to hear: "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest." This is not the rest of giving up. It is the rest that restores. The rest that reenergizes. The rest that sends us back into the world renewed.

God knows that our spiritual energy wears off. He knows that the daily battles, against sin, against discouragement, against the enemy, can drain us. He knows that even good, faithful disciples grow weary. And so today He gives us what we might call a spiritual recharge. Like grabbing a coffee to push through the afternoon. Like a lunch that restores your strength. Like a shot of energy in the arm that wakes up your whole body.

God says: "Don't grow weary. Don't stop fighting. Don't let the enemy convince you that the struggle isn't worth it. Because a reward awaits you. Because the journey leads somewhere. Because the One who calls you is faithful." So let these readings be your mid-year renewal. Let Christ lift your burdens. Let the Spirit breathe fresh strength into your soul. And then, renewed and reenergized, keep going. Keep fighting the good fight. Keep walking the path of holiness. God is with you. And He will lead you all the way home.

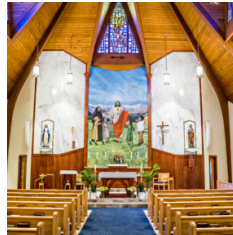

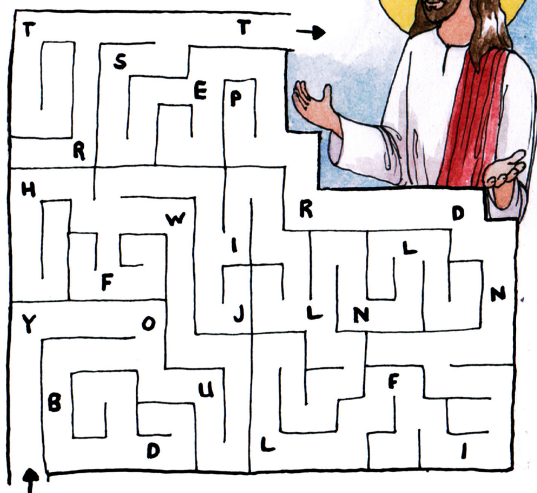

The Our Father part 3

"Hallowed be thy name."

When we call on God's name, we are invoking his presence and worshipping him.

Question to Ponder

The Catechism teaches that "when we say 'hallowed be thy name'; we ask that it should be hallowed in us, who are in him; but also in others whom God's grace still awaits, that we may obey the precept that obliges us to pray for everyone, even our enemies" (CCC 2814, quoting Tertullian).

How does this teaching change the way you understand this petition?

Reflection

"Hallowed" means to be holy. As we pray this part of the prayer, we are not praying that God's name will become holy, for His name already is holy. Rather, we pray that this holiness of God will be recognized by us and all people. We pray that there will be a deep reverence of God's name and that we will always treat God with the proper honor, devotion, love and awe we are called to give.

It's especially important to point out how often God's name is used in vain. That is a strange phenomenon.

Have you ever wondered why, when people get angry, they would curse God's name? It's strange. And, in fact, it's demonic. Anger, in those moments, invites us to act in a contrary way to this prayer and to the proper use of God's name.

God Himself is holy, holy, holy. He is thrice holy! In other words, He is the Holiest! Living with this fundamental disposition of heart is key to a good Christian life and to a good life of prayer.

Perhaps a good practice would be to regularly honor God's name. For example, what a wonderful habit it would be to regularly say, "Sweet and precious Jesus, I love You." Or, "Glorious and merciful God, I adore You." Adding adjectives like these before we mention God is a good habit to get into as a way of fulfilling this first petition of the Lord's Prayer.

Another good practice would be to always refer to the "Blood of Christ" we consume at Mass as the "Precious Blood." Or the Host as the "Sacred Host." There are many who fall into the trap of just referring to it as the "wine" or the "bread." This is most likely not malicious or even sinful, but it's much better to enter into the practice and habit of honoring and revering anything that is associated with God, especially the Most Holy Eucharist!

Stewardship Corner

One of the most well-known and beloved passages in scripture is the gentle invitation of our Lord in today's Gospel reading: "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest." When we need physical rest, we sleep or take a nap. When we need emotional rest, we take a break, go for a walk, or when the opportunity presents itself, take a few days off. But how do we find spiritual rest? How do we discover Christ's peace as we grapple with this time of uncertainty and its complex issues deep in our hearts? Good stewards find their rest in the Lord. Reflect this week on what you do to welcome the peace of Christ into your heart.
