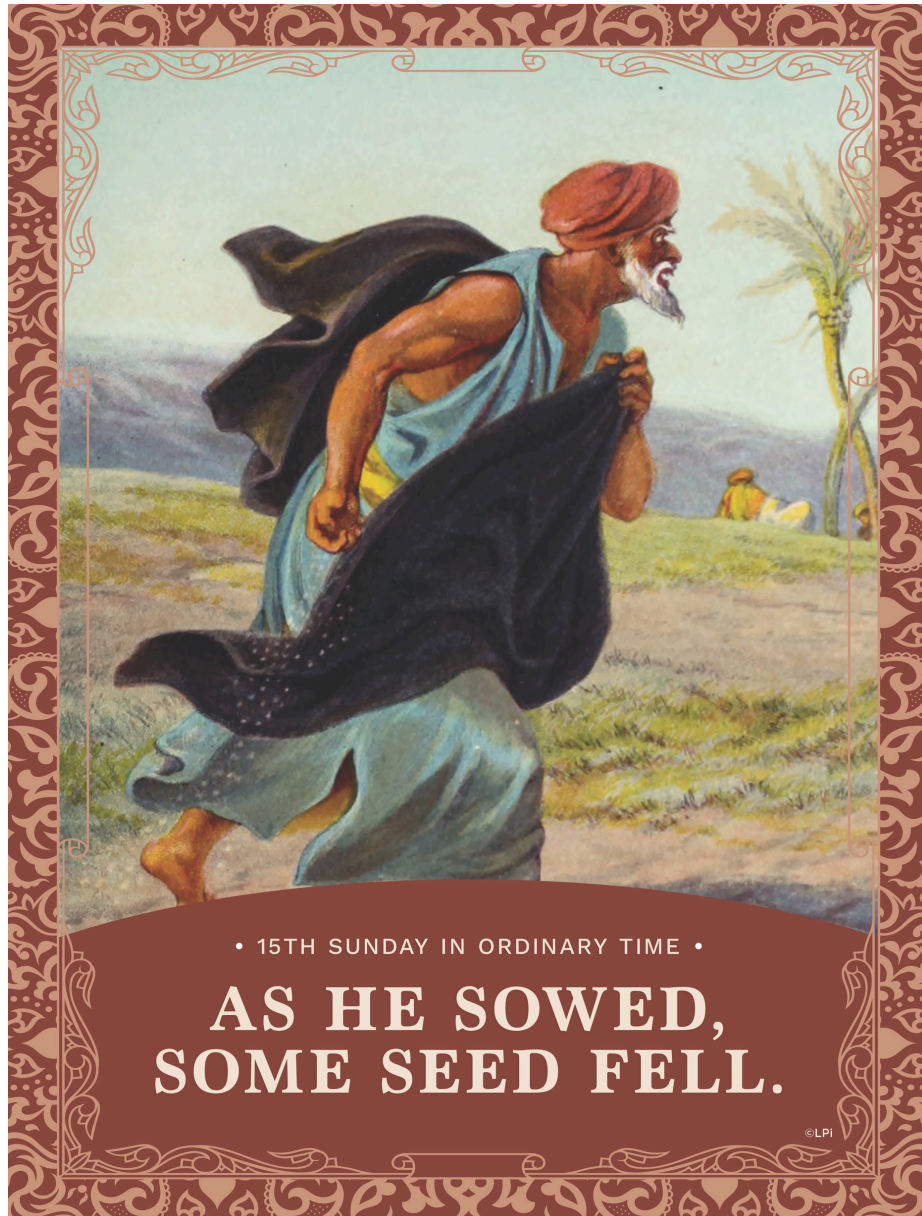

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

The readings today invite us to rethink how God works in our lives. Isaiah tells us that God's word is like rain: it falls quietly, without spectacle, yet it always accomplishes its purpose. Jesus, in the Gospel, speaks of the sower who scatters seeds, tiny, ordinary, almost invisible. Through these images, Scripture teaches us something essential: God's greatest works begin small.

We often expect God to act dramatically. We look for unmistakable signs, overwhelming feelings, sudden miracles. And when they do not appear, we assume God is absent or inactive. But Jesus deliberately chooses the most unimpressive symbol possible, a seed, to describe the Kingdom. A seed is tiny. You can lose it between your fingers. Yet inside that smallness is a power capable of transforming an entire landscape.

This is how grace works. Most of God's action in our hearts is quiet, subtle, and hidden. The seed grows underground, in darkness, in silence. You cannot watch it grow. You cannot measure its progress. You can only trust that something is happening. In the same way, God often works beneath the surface of our lives, through small nudges of conscience, brief moments of peace, a verse of Scripture that lingers, a desire to pray, a gentle impulse to forgive. These are not coincidences. They are seeds.

The danger is that we overlook them. We wait for something spectacular and miss the small beginnings God is already planting. We dismiss little opportunities to pray because they seem insignificant. We ignore small acts of charity because they do not feel heroic. We abandon small steps of conversion because they do not produce immediate results. Yet Jesus teaches that when these small seeds fall into good soil, they produce a harvest thirty, sixty, even a hundredfold, far beyond anything the farmer could imagine.

God does not need to begin with greatness. He only needs us to recognize the small beginnings of His work and allow them to grow. The Kingdom does not grow through spectacle, but its final outcome is spectacular.

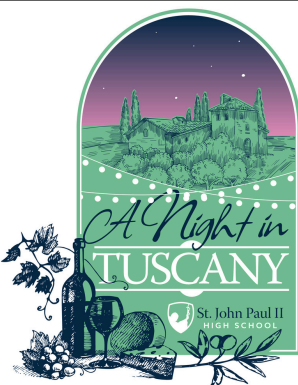

“Thy Kingdom Come”

This petition of the Lord's Prayer is a way of acknowledging two things. First, we acknowledge the fact that Jesus will, one day, return in all His glory and establish His permanent and visible Kingdom. This will be the time of the Final Judgment when the current Heaven and Earth will pass away and the new order will be established. So, praying this petition is a faith-filled acknowledgment of this fact. It's our way of saying we not only believe this will happen, we also look forward to it and pray for it.

Secondly, we must realize that the Kingdom of God is already here among us. For now, it's an invisible Kingdom. It's a spiritual reality that must become an all-consuming and present reality in our world.

To pray that God's “Kingdom come” means we desire that He first take greater possession of our souls. The Kingdom of God must be within us. He must reign on the throne of our hearts, and we must allow Him. Therefore, this must be our constant prayer.

We also pray that the Kingdom of God become present in our world. God wants to transform the social, political and cultural order right now. So we must pray and work for that. Our prayer for the Kingdom to come is also a way for us to commit ourselves to God to allow Him to use us for this very purpose. It's a prayer of faith and courage. Faith because we believe He can use us, and courage because the evil one and world will not like it. As the Kingdom of God is established in this world through us, we will meet with opposition. But that's ok and should be expected. And this petition is, in part, to help us with this mission.

THY KINGDOM COME!

“Hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven.”

These three petitions come first to show us that prayer must be focused on God's glory, his Kingdom, and his will, not our own. God is hallowed and glorified to the degree that we do his will. That's why heaven is a place of indescribable beauty and earth is marred by suffering and conflict.

Reflect this week on concrete ways you can remain faithful to the Gospel during these challenging times.
