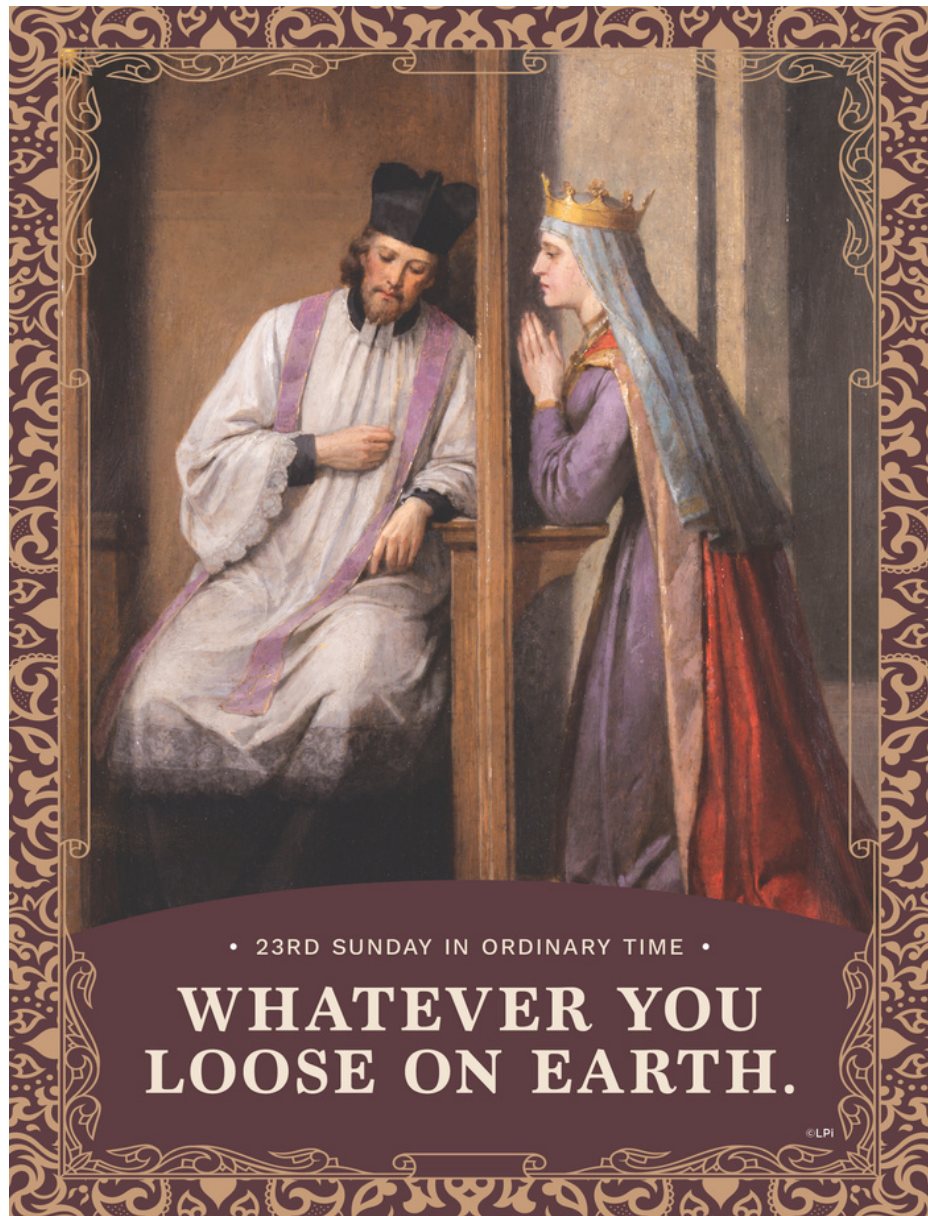

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

The readings today reveal something essential about the Christian life: love is responsibility. God commands us to love one another, but He also teaches us what that love truly looks like. It is not sentiment, not mere kindness, not telling people what they want to hear. Real love is the courage to desire another person's salvation, and to act for it.

In the first reading, God appoints Ezekiel as a watchman. His mission is simple but demanding: if he sees danger approaching and stays silent, he becomes responsible for the destruction that follows. But if he speaks, if he warns, corrects, and calls the people back, he has fulfilled his duty, even if they refuse to listen. God is teaching us that love watches over the soul of another. Silence in the face of sin is not compassion; it is abandonment.

St. Paul deepens this truth when he says that all commandments are summed up in one: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Love does no evil to the neighbor. But doing "no evil" is not passive. It means actively willing the good of the other. And the greatest good is eternal life. Therefore, love sometimes requires difficult conversations, honest correction, and the willingness to speak truth even when truth is uncomfortable.

Jesus Himself gives us a process for addressing a brother who sins. He does not say, "Ignore it," or "Affirm him so he feels supported." He says: go to him privately and speak the truth. If he refuses, bring witnesses. If he still refuses, bring it to the Church. Every step is motivated by one goal: to win back your brother. This is not judgment; it is charity. It is love that refuses to give up on someone's soul.

Today's readings challenge the modern idea that love means approval. Christ shows us that love means responsibility. Love means caring enough to intervene. Love means telling the truth with humility, patience, and gentleness, but telling it nonetheless. Love is not avoiding discomfort; love is accepting the burden of another's salvation. Every commandment God gives is a lesson in how to love rightly. But today He asks us to embrace the hardest part of love: the courage to speak truth for the sake of another's good.

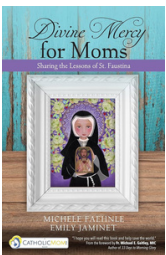

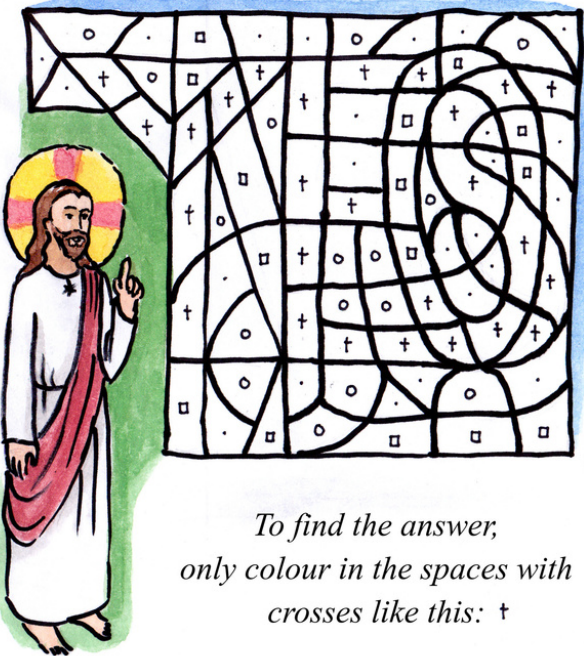

The Glory Be

Salve Regina part 1 (next week)

The "Glory Be" is far and away the most common Christian prayer after the Our Father and the Hail Mary. This prayer is called a doxology, from the Greek word meaning an expression of glory or praise. Christians usually use it as a way of summing up all their feelings and intentions at the end of some longer prayer. In a sense, the glory of God is the purpose and the content of all our prayers and actions, and so we bring them all together as our act of glorifying God in the Blessed Trinity.

The form of this prayer given in the Catechism of the Catholic Church is the one we teach our children; we use it most often when praying the rosary, at the end of each decade, or set of Hail Marys.

But this kind of prayer is found most of all in the Mass and at the end of every psalm or hymn in the Liturgy of the Hours. The collect prayed at the beginning of each Mass ends ". . . through Jesus Christ, your Son, Our Lord, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit for ever and ever. Amen." The Eucharistic prayer, which contains the high point of each Mass—the consecration of the bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ—ends with the beautiful "Through him, with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, forever and ever. Amen."

This prayer of glory has been added even to the Our Father, though Our Lord did not include it in his versions of the prayer. Catholics say this after the Our Father at Mass, but many non-Catholics add it every time they pray the Our Father: "For the kingdom, and the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever." Ending a prayer with this kind of praise was common in Old Testament worship and is often used in the New Testament by St. Paul in his epistles, St. Peter in his letters, and St. John in the book of Revelation.

If at any point in our lives, in joy or in sorrow, in the middle of troubles or struggles, in hope and in fear, when perhaps we cannot find the words, we can always pray perfectly that God may be glorified always, and so we will be praying for all we really want. In a way, we will be praying as God "prays," since the Savior prayed in the face of his deepest suffering, "Now, Father, glorify your Son with the glory he had before the world began"—that is, "as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen."
